Children love a challenge and this one will have the added benefit of helping them to develop their love of reading.

#### **School Lunches Next Term**

I said at the start of the year that we would review whether it was possible to reintroduce a hot lunch option in the new year. I regret to say that after much debate we have concluded that whilst we are required to operate a school bubble system we do not have the staff or the space to facilitate hot lunches and will need to continue with the packed lunch option.

Our reasoning for this is as follows: We cannot use the hall for lunches because there is not sufficient time to enable us to ensure that the room could be thoroughly cleaned between classes. In addition we are also having to use the hall as a staff room to ensure the safety of our staff. Bubbles require additional staff and we have redeployed the kitchen staff that would usually serve lunches to supervise children in their classes. We have considered the option of serving hot lunches in the classroom but that creates an additional complication of having to plate meals up and then transport them to the main building, whilst ensuring they remain hot and compliant with food hygiene regulations. Again we do not have the staff or the time to facilitate that. I am sorry that this will be a disappointment for many of you but please be assured that as soon as it is safe to do so we will return to hot lunches.

Our ability to provide the Christmas lunch is because as a staff we did not want to deprive the children of something many of them really enjoy. For this reason staff have volunteered to help and put in additional hours. All our staff will be involved in serving food and supervising children and whilst we can do this as a special occasion it is not sustainable every day.

## INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS

#### Van Gogh

It has been an eventful week, but the children have taken it all in their stride.

<u>Phonics:</u> We will continue to focus on rhyming and oral segmenting and blending and would encourage parents to help their children by sharing books with rhymes and playing games to help them learn to orally segment and blend simple words.

Even though we have worked through Phase 2 in phonics and would appreciate if you could continue working with your child to consolidate these sounds. This week the children have been working on *ar, or, oo* (as in moon). The children have found these quite tricky so we will be re-vising them next week. Digraphs and trigraphs are tricky sounds, so please continue to learn and reinforce them. The children will continue to also work in their ability groups on their specific sounds/targets.

**Reading:** Please continue to share books your children as well as hearing them read and learning the tricky word sets highlighted in their reading record. If you have not read the books and would like to keep them a bit longer, please put a note in the wallet. Please could you ensure that wallets are bought into school on Friday together with reading books so that we can change the books for the following week.

Math: We are will continue to consolidate one, two and three and next week meet FOUR!

<u>Mind Up:</u> This week we looked at mindful listening and the importance of having a key focus. Next week we will be looking at mindful seeing, when we will look at something and talk about what we see, before taking a closer look.

<u>Topic:</u> The children have great fun dressing up in the role play area and learning all about the Hindu religion. Even though we will continue with this topic over the next few weeks, we are going into December and will start learning all about advent too.

Please ensure that your child has a pair of wellies (to be left in school) and a coat, as we do often go for walks and spend a lot of our day outside.

We hope that you are all doing well at home - the children are generally so happy in school and with good focus on their learning which is great to see.

#### **English**

Next week is our final week on Greek Myths. We will be planning, writing and editing our own Greek Myth using all the skills we have learnt already in this unit. Our grammar work includes adjectives and descriptive work. Our spelling rule is words with the /s/ sound spelt sc (Latin origin).

#### Math

In Maths we will be tackling division. The children have worked so hard on the other operations over this term and we hope that they are able to continue challenging themselves to apply these skills.

Being able to recall times tables is key to the children succeeding at an increasing rate - please encourage your child to keep up their learning of these.

### Other subjects

In PSHE we will be looking more at relationships. Our Science unit takes us onto refraction of light and exploring investigations around this. In PE the children have been doing well with their fitness circuits on a Friday and this will continue over the next few weeks.

Our topic work will focus on Ancient Greek democracy and how the systems worked. We will also be revising our counting to 30 in Spanish and learning the months of year.
