#### **Headteacher's News**

Dear Parents,

It has certainly has been a busy half term and this week was no exception. I have met with all the teachers this week to discuss the children's progress and it has been a pleasure to see how much they have learned during the last six weeks. #### Re: Parents' Evenings-March 19th and March 21st

I would like to trial a new system of booking parents' evening slots through our school website. A letter has been put in your child's book bag today with a letter indicating your username and password. Please go to the home page <a href="http://www.chenies.bucks.sch.uk/website/home/56919">http://www.chenies.bucks.sch.uk/website/home/56919</a> and select the green log in button. When logging on for the first time we advise you to change your password by clicking on the cog icon. Once logged in, click on the Parents Evening tab which will enable you to see your child's name and be able to book a time slot that suits you. If you have more than one child you should click on the 'select pupil' button to book an appointment for another child. In addition you will also now be able to view your child's attendance record on the same page.

The parents evening appointments will become available for you to book on **Monday February 25th** and **close on Friday March 15<sup>th</sup>.** You will not be able to book a slot before February 25th.

If you have any problems at all, do phone eSchools on Tel: 0845 5577056. They will not be able to help you with your log in details, but they can talk you through the booking process, should you need any help.

I am hoping that this system will be efficient and easy to use but as with all new ways of working we will not know until we try it. Please do feedback to me about how you find using it, so I can decide whether it is something we want to use again in the future.

#### Pegasus and Griffin Stationery

One of the requests that the children in KS2 have made to me is that they should be allowed to use their own stationery in the classroom. The staff and I have agreed that they can bring in their own stationery as long as the following rules are adhered to. Pencils case should be plain and simple and need to fit in their trays. Children need a pencil, a pen with blue ink eg: berol handwriting pen or uniball and a rubber. The children should not bring in pencil sharpeners and scented pencils/pens and rubbers are not permitted. There is no requirement that children have to bring their own stationery and those who wish to do so can continue to use the school equipment they already have.

## INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS

#### Sprites:

**Phonics:** Next week the children will continue to work through Phase 2 and Phase 3 and consolidate sounds learnt to date. They will use their knowledge of phonics to segment and blend to read/write new words across all areas of learning.

To make the 'tricky words' a little bit more exciting from next term the children will be coming home with Super hero and Princess words. The word lists will be in the back of their reading records.

**Literacy:** We will be continuing to learn about stringing a sentence together. The children are given a picture or a set of cards as a prompt *e.g. a cat sitting on a mat*. They count the number of words (six) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words.

<u>Maths</u>: We have started to work on addition by counting on from a given number using a range of apparatus. We will also be touching on measuring as a part of topic.

**Topic:** We will be continuing with our Food Creation & Chinese New Year topics. The first week back we are learning about recipes/instructions and will be cooking stir fry.

#### **Phoenix Class**

In Phoenix class after the holiday we will be carrying on learning about how things grow and waiting for our potatoes to sprout.

In maths following assessments this week, we will be looking at sharing and division and how it is related to multiplication. We will also being doing more work on shape and fractions of shape.

In literacy we will be reading poetry and learning some poems off by heart. We will be writing our own using our ideas.

As a class we will be looking at ways we can be more independent and help ourselves to solve problems and keep track of our belongings.

#### Pegasus

After half-term in English we will be starting our new "live" focus. In this, we will work towards creating a tour guide of Chenies School.

In maths we are going to continue looking at measurements, starting with looking at millilitres and litres.

Pegasus will continue their work on the Tudors. We will be looking at the Age of Sail during the Tudor period and learn about what life at sea was like. In science we will continue experimenting with sound. We will then use what we have learnt so far to start designing a windchime.

#### Griffin

English

After half term we will be moving our focus in English to the text 'Oranges in No Man's Land' by Elizabeth Laird. This is a book on the Year 5 and 6 recommended reading list. We will spend time reading and comprehending the text across a few weeks. In the first week we will focus on the first few chapters; reading and understanding them, exploring the themes and writing in different genres in response to the text.

#### Maths

We will begin the half term with a focus on percentages. We have been very impressed by the children's understanding of fractions and calculating with them, therefore we are sure they will quickly understand how percentages work. We will be particularly working on finding a percentage of an amount or quantity and looking at real life problems and situations where we need to use this skill. Once again, times tables knowledge is crucial!

#### Торіс

We continue our Frozen Kingdom topic next half term. We will be learning about climate change in detail, in the week after half term. Our Science unit next half term will be Animals, including humans, with a focus mainly on understanding life cycles of animals. In the first week, we will be developing our techniques and completing our art work of The Northern Lights. We also have many more songs to rehearse for the music festival at the end of term. Recorders - remember to practise too!

We have not set formal homework for half term, as we would like to encourage the children to rest, have fun and enjoy some fresh air - hopefully we can then rid ourselves of the awful bugs that seem to have been plaguing us all! If you wish your child to do anything, please encourage them to continue to learn the year 5 and 6 spelling words, read - for enjoyment and there are always games loaded on their Activelearn account none of this is however, expected or will be monitored. Have a lovely half term Griffin class!
