End of Term Thoughts and David Hockney

Some of you may have seen an item about David Hockney on BBC news on Wednesday. He gave a very moving account of his thoughts about the troubled times we are faced with and is sharing 10 of his most recent images (including one animation), nine of which have never been published before, for us all to enjoy at this difficult time, along with his thoughts on the role of art in life. He said this:

"The only real things in life are food and love in that order, just like our little dog Ruby. I really believe this and the source of art is love."

Many of you I know are anxious about the effect that not being in school will have on your children both socially and academically. Some are concerned that they will have fallen behind by the time they return to school. If you are one of those people (and even if you are not) I want to say this to you: all your child needs from you to make the most of life is food and love, in that order.
