Sprites:

Phonics: We will be learning and consolidating sounds in Phase 2 and Phase 3. The children will be encouraged to use their knowledge and understanding of phonics to segment/blend to read and write across all areas of learning.

The Super hero and Princess tricky words are in the back of the reading records. Please continue to reinforce these.

Literacy: We will be continuing to learn about stringing a sentence together **e.g. the dog is white**. They count the number of words (four) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. We will also be talking about nouns – verbs – adjectives. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words independently.

<u>Maths</u>: this term we will focus on different types of measure using a variety of equipment. We will also have a 'snack shop' where the children will pretend to pay for their milk, fruit and water.

Topic: Growing – Next week we will be focusing on the children and keeping healthy.

Phoenix Class

In Phoenix class next week we will be reading Six Dinner Sid and thinking about the story in the context of literacy. We will also be thinking about some of the animals we keep at home as pets.

In Maths Year Two are looking at fractions of numbers and Year One will continue to look at adding ten and taking away ten from two digit numbers.

Pegasus

Welcome back! This week we have started our new topic, which will focus on climates and habitats as well as the animals that live in them. We have already started looking at classifying animals based on common characteristics and the children have started a project on measuring the rainfall in school over the past few days.

Next week in Maths we will be continuing looking at statistics. We have looked at pictograms and bar charts and we will continue looking at gathering and interpreting data.

In English we will continue looking at our class fiction book "Christophe's Story", focusing on comprehension.

In topic we will continue looking at the weather and different ways to measure them. The children will look at how the wind is measured and will be creating their own wind vains to use to gather data as a class. In science, we will be looking at the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates.

Year 4 will be learning gardening and cooking skills as part of DT while year 3 will be working with horses. Year 3 and 4 will then later swap giving each year group a chance to work with horses and take part in the DT lessons.

Griffin

English

We will be focussing on ensuring that the children have a secure understanding of the grammar and writing skills that they need to prepare them fully for their upcoming assessments. The children have had the opportunity to share the areas they would like to work on, as well as an interest in continuing their written work linked to the Titanic which we started work on last term. We will also be focussing on improving our reading comprehension. It is really important that your child is spending time every day reading at home and recording this in their reading records, as well as practicing spellings – both weekly and the set of statutory spelling words for year 5/6.

Maths

In maths, we will also be preparing the children for their assessments, by working on the skills that have not yet been covered this year so far – including geometry work and shape, space and measures work. We will also be working on time – including reading times, reading timetables and applying these skills. We will be revisiting some of the areas of maths that need a bit more practice. As we so often say – times tables are key to solving questions faster and underpin lots of the work that we do – please ensure that your child is practicing these at home!

Topic

Our science work this term relates to forces and light and we are hoping to do lots of investigative work relating to this over the following term. The children carried out some pupil-led investigations last term and showed good thinking and ideas, so we will hopefully develop this further. In PE we will be continuing to develop our skipping skills. Please ensure that your child always has their full PE kit in schools – this is essential in case PE days change at last minute.
