INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS

Phoenix

In Phoenix class this week during <u>Literacy</u> we will be thinking about information texts and using our topic learning to write our own ones.

In <u>maths</u> we will be learning about money and continuing to learn times tables, focusing on multiples of 5 and 10.

Our area of learning this week in topic is <u>Things That Grow</u>. We will be looking at trees in the local area, learning about their structure and how to identify different types.

Pegasus

Next week in <u>English</u> we will continue reading the book "Ottoline and the Yellow Cat" by Chris Riddell. The children will be continuing to read and discuss the book, using inference to create predictions of what may happen. They will also be learning how to note take.

In <u>maths</u> we are going to continue looking at fractions. By the end of the week, the children should be able to add and subtract fractions as well as count in them on a numberline.

Pegasus will continue learning about the Tudors. They will be looking into some key figures of the time, such as Elizabeth I. In science we are going to continue experimenting with sounds by creating a "DIY" guitar and looking to see what causes a sound to change pitch.

Sprites

<u>Phonics</u>: Next week the children will continue to work through Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds focusing on segmenting and blending to read/write new words across all areas of learning. The key sounds that we will be consolidating are the <u>diagraphs – ck | II | ff | ss | zz</u>. These sounds are usually found in the middle or the end of a word **e.g.** <u>duck buzzing</u>. Our tricky word focus is **he**, **she**, **we**, **& be**. We will continue to reinforce **I**, **to**, **go**, **no & the**.

<u>Literacy:</u> We are learning about stringing a sentence together. The children are given a picture or a set of cards as a prompt *e.g. a cat sitting on a mat*. They count the number of words (six) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words.

<u>Maths:</u> We will continue to learn the names of 3D shapes (sphere, cylinder, cube and cone) and looking at how they are made up of 2D shapes.

<u>Topic:</u> Going with the children's interest we have decided to change our topic to 'Food Creation' which has been inspired by our class text George's Marvellous Medicine. We will be mixing potions, doing science experiments and creating our own recipes.

We will also use our knowledge and understanding of 2D/3D shapes to create and construct models of different forms of transport using a range of materials.

Griffin

English

The children have planned and started writing a junior handbook for an explorer in the Amazon. They will finish these next week and work on editing and improving them. They are being encouraged to include the following: fronted adverbials, subordinating phrases, a variety of conjunctions, varied sentence lengths and structures and a range of advanced punctuation correctly (colons, commas for lists, semi-colons etc). Our next English unit will be based around poetry; looking at powerful language.

Maths

We have been very impressed with the children's division work this week - year 6 have taken to long division well! We will finish looking at how to round answers up or down according to multiplication or division problems given. We will also focus on ratio and scaling problems and end the week focusing on multi-step problems using all operations.

Topic

Our science work next week will continue to focus on classification and animals. Our Frozen Kingdom work will centre around exploring and researching different topics of the polar regions eg climate, population, weather, and using these to produce a written report about them. On Wednesday it is Griffin's turn for French. The class worked so well together at the Dodgeball tournament last week - we were proud of their teamwork and behaviour - well done Griffin!
