INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS

Sprites:

Phonics: We will be learning and consolidating sounds in Phase 2 and Phase 3. The children will be encouraged to use their knowledge and understanding of phonics to segment/blend to read and write across all areas of learning.

The Super hero and Princess tricky words are in the back of the reading records. Please continue to reinforce these.

Literacy: We will be continuing to learn about stringing a sentence together *e.g. the dog is white*. They count the number of words (four) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. We will also be talking about nouns – verbs – adjectives. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words independently.

<u>Maths</u>: We will be continuing with different types of measure using a variety of equipment. The key word this week will be 'non-standard measures' the children will be finding ways of measuring. We will also continue with our 'snack shop' where the children will pretend to pay for their milk, fruit and water.

Topic: Growing – We continue to talk about keeping healthy with the focus this being on how we grow.
