### INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS

#### Sprites:

Phonics: Next week the children will continue to work through Phase 2 and Phase 3 and consolidate sounds learnt to date. They will use their knowledge of phonics to segment and blend to read/write new words across all areas of learning.

The Super hero and Princess tricky words are in the back of the reading records. Please continue to reinforce these.

Literacy: We will be continuing to learn about stringing a sentence together. The children are given a picture or a set of cards as a prompt **e.g.** the dog is white. They count the number of words (four) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. We will also be talking about nouns – verbs – adjectives. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words.

Maths: We will be learning about subtraction this week. We will be introducing the different vocabulary and using different apparatus to work out problems. The children will also be using money in the role play area. Please help your child to recognise coins and apply them to addition problems.

#### Phoenix Class

In Phoenix class we will be continuing to look at the work of Beatrix Potter. We will be writing our own stories and looking at story structure and patterns.

In maths we have been using arrays to help understand times tables. Next week we will be using learnt facts to help with adding and subtraction calculations.

In science we will be learning about the similarities and differences between some animals and identifying features common to a particular habitat.

#### **Pegasus**

Next week in English, Pegasus will be planning and writing their tours of Chenies School, as well as doing some writing around the trip to St. Albans.

In maths we are going to start looking at time and reading clocks, in digital and analogue.

All topic work next week will be based around R.E and the topic of Easter.

#### Griffin

#### English

Next week, we will be using our trip to the cathedral to inspire some writing along with looking a lot more at the grammar skills that we need to learn. Our work also continues with our text, Oranges in No Man's Land and again, we will be producing writing inspired by this and linking new or revised grammar techniques to our writing.

#### Maths

We will complete our work on area and perimeter next week, including work on other quadrilaterals. We will also be looking at the volume of shapes and the formula for working this out. We will continue our work on 2D shapes and begin looking at co-ordinates.

#### Topic

After a fantastic, informative talk from Mrs Palfreman, the children - who listened beautifully and engaged so well with their questioning - will learn and write about the race to the pole. Singing will also feature, ahead of our rehearsal on Friday morning.

In science, we will be undertaking our own investigations into gravity. The children have designed their own experiments to find out more about this force. Our PE work sees us finishing our gymnastics unit by putting all our skills together.
