Van Gogh Class News

Welcome back, I hope you have all had a restful break!

The children have come a few centimetres taller and ready to learn. They this week they have been writing about what they did over their holidays and their favourite presents. We have also introduced our snack shop, where the children are learning to pay for their snack using 5p, 2p and 1p coins.

Reading

As the children are becoming more confident with their reading, books we will now be changed on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Even though we encourage parents to read every night with their child, please do not rush through the books. We are happy to change the books as and when your child had finished reading them. Please remember to write a note in your child's reading record every time you read with them.

Library books this term will be changed every Friday. Please note that your child will not be able to bring another book home until they have returned ones borrowed previously.

<u>Phonics</u>: Please continue to work through the Jolly Phonics sounds, practice segmenting and blending to read and write CV and CVC words. This week we will continue to reinforce $I \ \underline{II} \ f \ \underline{ff} \ s \ \underline{ss} \ c \ k \ \underline{ck.}$ We will also be introducing j v w x y z and ch sh th ng nk.

Tricky Words: Set 1/2/3/4 on the high frequency list

- <u>Maths:</u> Counting: Ordering and Recognising Numbers to 5/10/15/20 Counting on from a given number. Looking at the value of a number and matching objects
 - Shape: Consolidating **2D** shapes and introducing the **properties** e.g. I am a triangle, I have 3 straight sides and three corners. I am a circle I have 1 curved side and no corners.

In our snack shop we have started to look at the value of different coins 5p 2p 1p. The children are children are encouraged to pay for their snack thinking about different ways of making an amount e.g. Milk 8p – children may use 8 x 1p coins – 4 x 2p coins – 5p 2p 1p. Please give your child the opportunity to 'play' with different coins encouraging them to recognise and understand the different values.

Monet Class News

This term Monet's topic is all about "Abodes - Houses and Homes."

In Maths we will be working on addition. Year one will be working on number bonds and facts on numbers up to 10 and year 2 will be working on adding 2 digit numbers.

In English we will be looking at non-fiction books and learning about animal abodes. We have an exciting visitor coming in next Thursday and will be having live trout in school.

In Science we will be investigating materials in science and looking at what materials are used for building man-made homes and animal homes.

In geography we will be looking at the homes and country we live in and learning about geographical locations in the UK.

In art and dt we will be looking at the design of different homes and thinking about designing and making our own miniature homes out of small boxes and recycled materials. If you could start to collect some recycled materials in preparation for this that would be great. Each child will need a box which is big enough to make a miniature room in.

Hockney Class News

Welcome back! I hope that everyone had a stress free and restful break over the holidays. In Maths next week the children will continue to focus on learning strategies and methods to solve division problems.

In English, we have started our legends unit, and the children will be exploring what the features of legends are as well as further developing their descriptive writing skills.

In Science the children have started looking at the states of matter, having learnt about what solids, liquids and gasses are. Next week we will be experimenting with the physicality of gasses.

In History, the children have started to learn about the Anglo-Saxons, and we will be continuing looking that the life of the Anglo-Saxon invaders and settlers.

In Geography, children will start learning about geographical features such as volcanoes, and events such as earthquakes and how these things are linked to the movement of tectonic plates.

In ICT children will continue learning how to code and sequence their instructions in order to get the result they want and how to debug if they do not.

In PSHE the children will be learn more about their brains and how to be mindful in their environments.

Happy new year! We hope you had a restful Christmas break. We also wanted to say a huge thank you for the very generous Christmas gifts and well-wishes - we are very grateful and touched by your thoughtfulness.

In English next week we will be continuing the work we started this week using the non-fiction ebook 'Animals on the Move'. We will be creating an audio commentary as well as focussing on our grammar skills.

In Maths we will be following on from the brilliant start the children have already made to their division skills. We have been pleased with how well the children have worked on this so far. Times tables again are crucial to mastering this skill - it is very evident in class those who know these as their division speed is much faster.

In topic we will be finding out more about Mexico as we move further into our topic 'Hola Mexico'. This topic emcompasses our Geography, History (The Mayans) and Art work. Science sees us continuing with the start we have made on evolution and inheritance and in PE we will be doing gymnastics and basketball. There are still children who do not have their full PE kit including trainers in school. This is essential and must be in every day.
