Monet Class News

Next week in literacy we will be starting a non-fiction unit learning about unusual places people live around the world. We'll be looking at features of non-fiction texts.

In maths we will be learning about measuring capacities of containers and recording our findings using block graphs and pictograms.

In science we will continue to look at animal food chains and learn about omnivores, carnivores and herbivores.

Our topic focus will be history and learning about the features of castles and Victorian homes and comparing homes today with homes from the past and we will be relating our art work to castles by looking at famous castle and landscape paintings.

And of course it will be world book day on Thursday so we are looking forward to a day spent with our houses doing fun book related activities.

Hockney Class News

I hope everyone has had a lovely half term break.

The English the children will continue looking at the Shang Dynasty of ancient China, learning how to find and record facts, as well as looking at using nouns and pronouns.

In maths we will continue looking at decimals and their relation to fractions.

In Science the children will be learning about plants and what they need in order to grown.

In PSHE, as part of their MindUp lessons, the children will look at mindful movement.

In ICT they will be learning to create pieces of digital art.

Hepworth Class News

English

We have started to explore the book 'Stormbreaker' by Anthony Horowitz. This story is marking it's 20th Anniversary since publication and is the first in a series of twelve books all featuring the character Alex Rider on his spy adventures. Next week we will continue to focus on the story by exploring spy missions and describing the settings they take place in. There will be a grammar focus of adverbs, adjectives, similes and metaphors.

Maths

For the first part of the week we will focus on measures. We will be revising units of measurement for length, weight and capacity and work on converting measurements from one to another. This is an area of maths that can feature in everyday life and therefore a good opportunity to discuss maths in the home, for example using ml or litres in cooking, measuring a length in mm, cm or m. Year 6 will also look at converting metric to imperial measures. We will also look more at shape following on from this week and this will include work on the properties of quadrilaterals and parts of circles.

Other areas of learning

We will begin our science topic of properties and changes of materials by exploring soluble materials. Singing will also feature highly in our week as we step up our preparations for the InConcert Musical festival. In RE we will be comparing different places of worship within Christianity.

We will be enjoying taking part in the World Book Day activities that we have planned on Thursday and we look forward to seeing some brilliant costumes. We are also hoping to see Hepworth class taking on the responsibility of helping to guide and support the younger children in the sessions as it is a great opportunity for them to show this caring side and to build their skills doing this.

Homework

This week the children have an arithmetic paper and part of a reading comprehension paper to complete. 30 minutes for each piece is enough time to spend on them. The children know that if they are unsure of a question they should leave it and move to the next to show what they can do. There are no areas of the maths paper that they have not been taught this year, so this way of practising and revisiting their prior learning whilst in class we are not working on calculations in the same way.
