What one thing would make Chenies School better for your child?

- Better meals
- HLP homework should be traditional and focused on individual targets. There should be weekly Math and English homework and HLP should only be for the remaining subjects
- Confidence building for them individually
- Split the classes back into year groups and have 30 per year group no combined groups
- Having more things to do at playtimes e.g. use the back playground
- Before and after school clubs
- All the toilets are not really great and I do worry about security at playtime as it's easy to access from the road perhaps that's where PTA money should go
- A before and after school club
- To encourage and stretch their learning further
- There are areas of the school in need of resources, both in the class and in the playground
- Would be great if the school had Halal meals
- Good quality before and after school clubs and homework clubs
- HLP it would be better to receive one bit of homework each week so that it can be related to the theme subject or any other
- Better discipline and management of poor behaviour
- Electronic gates outside, so during class time no stranger can come in. (They have to press the electric button to get into school)
- Better communications some emails I have sent to the school haven't been responded to but now the teachers have email addresses I'm sure this will rectify the problem.
- Of course the school has Victorian charm but some modernisation would make the school a brighter and better learning environment
- New girls' toilet would be great
- I think homework could be better. I don't feel there is enough enthusiasm to do the HLP tasks as homework doesn't get marked
- I can't think of anything
- More frequent information regarding child's progress and support

Any other comments

- On the whole we love Chenies and are very pleased with the progress our girls make. Both were identified at parents evening as lacking in confidence advice from school about how to improve this would be helpful. Re discipline, I think that for some children minutes are insufficient
- Replace HLP with weekly Maths and English sheets that are marked each week more motivational and beneficial to the children and help parents understand where child needs to be. Replace end of week minutes with daily punishments on the day the incident happens. Homework club with access to Maths Whizz and a teacher who can provide help
- The school has too many parents being members of staff. If you need to go into the office after school, there are too many PTA parents in there to speak to a teacher or office staff confidentially. It would be nice to see teachers mark the medal maths when the children spend a lot of time doing it
- We LOVE Chenies and would recommend it to other parents
- Chenies is a fantastic little school! My son loves attending and is progressing well. Thank you to all the teachers and staff and management team for all your hard work and commitment to the children in your care
- Please could we have a security light outside the school for evening actions. It's dangerous and unsettling when it's so dark
- I am pleased the school will be receiving much needed refurbishment of the toilets in KS1 which will benefit the whole school. It is a shame this has taken so long. I would like to think the school would receive regular maintenance of the school and buildings. The school needs outside lighting, the darkness causes issues when families visit the school as a danger in visibility and recently cars were broken into on parents' evening. Lighting would discourage crime and provide a safe environment

- Small school and very lovely staff
- Parking is dreadful, in the morning driving out of Chenies past the Red Phoenix is nearly impossible with cars parked on both sides of the road. Also unless you have time to get to school 20 minutes early you end up parking by the garden centre. I know I can park in the Bedford Arms but both directions are dangerous to walk with young, excited children. Can't pickups be staggered; Sprites go at 3 (who don't have siblings) or something?
- Homework needs to be mandatory NOT optional, especially in years 5 and 6. Why not choose one option English, Maths, Theme, PE, ICT or Art and ask for it to be submitted in 1 week. Failure to do so should result in a loss of star time or lunchtime detentions. Maybe work with other local schools such as Little Chalfont. Each teacher visits a corresponding school to observe and learn/gain ideas. They are significantly stricter on discipline and homework than Chenies. PGL only for year 6 maybe combine with another school
- It would be nice to have a photo of all the Governors, what their roles are and when they meet. The parents have no idea what they do and how hard they work and it's not all their fault! Before school club, we would only use it occasionally but I think it is a good idea. The maximum we would pay is £3 per child would this include breakfast? Probably not
- I feel so lucky for my daughter to attend Chenies. She is very happy at the school and I can see that she is gaining great British manners. Thank you
- We would rather have traditional homework (Maths and English every week rather than every half term).
