## **INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS**

### **Sprites**

Stay for Breakfast Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July 2019 – Some people have been asking for details.

- Gates will be open for Sprites parents, siblings & family at 8.15
- Parents are expected to bring their own picnic breakfast
- This is purely a social event and opportunity for the EYFS team to say thank you.
- You are welcome to stay until 10.15 but there are no obligations. Please feel free to leave at any time.

**Phonics:** We are consolidating sounds in Phase 2 and Phase 3. The children will be encouraged to use their knowledge and understanding of phonics to segment/blend to read and write across all areas of learning.

The Superhero and Princess tricky words are in the back of the reading records. Please continue to reinforce these.

Some children will be starting to work on Phase 4. In Phase 4, no new graphemes are introduced. The main aim of this phase is to consolidate the children's knowledge and to help them learn to read and spell words which have adjacent consonants, such as *trap, string and milk*.

Tricky Words – During Phase 4 the following tricky words (which can't yet be decoded) are introduced: *said* – *have* – *like* – *so* – *do* – *some* – *come* – *were* – *there* – *little* – *one* – *when* - *out* - *what* 

<u>Literacy</u>: We will be continuing to learn about stringing a sentence together *e.g. the dog is white*. They count the number of words (four) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. We will also be talking about nouns – verbs – adjectives. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words independently.

<u>Maths</u>: We will be consolidating previous learning and introducing number bonds of 5 - 7 - 10 (different ways to make these numbers using two digits e.g. 1 + 4 = 5 2 + 3 = 5 3 + 2 = 5. We will also continue with our 'snack shop' where the children will pretend to pay for their milk, fruit and water.

### Phoenix

In Phoenix class next week we will still be looking at ways to improve our writing overall. We are recapping and introducing some of the Grammar taught at KS1 to consolidate our learning.

In Maths we are looking at coins and using money in a practical way to buy things and give change.

Our learning about the seaside has taken some interesting turns, mainly to do with rocks and we are continuing to explore this.

### Pegasus

This week in Pegasus, the children will be continuing with their recapping of fractions in maths. In English we will be continuing with our poetry unit.

Next week, Pegasus will need to make sure that they bring in their full P.E kit; trainers, shorts, coloured PE top, as they will have PE on Monday, sports day on Tuesday and tennis practice on Wednesday.

Year 4 will continue with going to the stables and year 3 will be cooking with tomatoes.

In topic, the children will continue with their history topic of looking at the changes in British fashion since 1066.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of July, the children in Pegasus class will be tie-dying as part of their history topic – looking at the change in fashion in Britain since 1066. I would be grateful if your child could bring a white or light coloured fabric item to school for the task. This could be something as small as a handkerchief, but other things such as socks, shirts, vests or pillowcases are also fine. They will then be able to take home their tie-dyed item.

### Griffin

Next week sees our house captains working hard to ensure that their teams do their best in sports day. We are very proud of the 4 boys who lead their houses - they've done a brilliant job throughout the year. We are certain that the children in Griffin will all be good sports: supporting and cheering on their teams and doing their best to win points for their houses.
