## Van Gogh

This week the children have enjoyed exploring the outdoor area and getting use the rules and routines across the school. We have been learning about our brain and how the different parts help learn, remember, think, understand our feelings and make good choices.

**Phonics:** We will be introducing the following sounds I N M D throughout the week and learning how to segment and blend simple words using all sounds learnt to date: E.g. i-n (in) a-t (at) s-a-t (sat) t-i-n (tin) d-a-d (dad) m-a-n (man) p-i-n (pin) s-a-d (sad) etc.

Tricky Words: A (a) – a cat on a mat. I – I am going to school. The (the) – the dog is big.

The children will be coming home with a sound mat to help you support them to form the letters correctly and reinforce the sounds next week.

Literacy: We will be practicing writing our names and orally segmenting & blending words.

Maths: Counting and Recognising Numbers to 5/10/15/20 - Days of the week

**Topic:** Mind Up – Key words Pre-Frontal Cortex – Amygdala – Hippocampus

### Monet

**Literacy:** We will be using the book 'Who's Our New Teacher by Jeanne Willis as the focus of our learning this week to focus on reading comprehension and making inferences and predictions about the text. When you are reading to your children at home please do encourage them to make predictions and explain their reasons for what they think.

**Maths:** Year 1 will be looking at how much each coin to 10p is worth and then begin to find the total of two coins and write the corresponding addition sum. They will also be practising telling the time to the hour and half past on analogue clocks.

Year 2 will be looking at how much all coins are worth and adding the value of 2 coins. They will be using ordered lists to find all possibilities when solving problems. They will be read the time to the half hour on digital and analogue clocks.

**Topic:** We will be talking about belonging to different groups, continuing our work on using the internet safely and learning more about the brain.

**Reminder:** The children are participating in Outdoor Adventure Activities on Tuesday and need to be collected from The Misbourne School at 3pm. Please can you ensure children have their PE kit in school again on Thursday for their PE lesson.

New date: There will be a reading workshop for parents on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October at 9am

## Hockney

Next week in Hockney class, the children will continue looking at place value in maths, and understanding the value of 3 and 4 digit numbers by partitioning them and sorting them into their correct columns. In addition they will practice rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

In English we will continue with the book Storm by Kevin Crossley-Holland, focussing descriptive writing, using adjectives and figurative language to set a mood.

In science, the children will continue looking at animals and humans. We will continue looking at skeletons and finding out the scientific names for them

In computing, the children are currently learning about online safety. They will be learning about online advertisements and how to be aware what they are and how to identify them.

### Hepworth

Next week we will continue our work on 'Friend or Foe'. We will use drama to explore a scene that we could add to the story. Following this, we will plan and write the scene; focusing on the use of speech in writing and use of paragraphs. We will then work on how to edit and improve our writing. Through this work we will continue to explore characters, themes and the effect of the war in the story.

#### Maths

We will begin the week looking at how to round numbers. We will revise and learn the rules around when to round up or round down according to different rules eg rounding to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000. Later in the week our focus will move to looking at factors, multiples, prime, square and cube numbers.

#### Topic

We will continue our work on Word War 2, using the research completed as homework, on Winston Churchill, alongside pictures of him, to write a detailed biography of his life and key speeches he gave. We will also consider the views others had of him. In computing we will continue to plan our podcasts and think about audio advertising. In science, we will delve deeper into the components of blood - exploring microscope images of this. We will also learn about the heart and blood vessels. Our Mind Up work will also continue, with us identifying how to be more mindful and exploring how pausing and focusing mindfully can help us, leading to us taking brain breaks.

PE kits MUST be in school every day - including trainers. We would ideally prefer Hepworth children to also have socks to change into for sport.
