Reflection & Celebration

As we come to the end of our time at Chenies, we have reflected on the many positive changes that we have made since the Co-Headship began in September 2015. Here are just a few:

• **New Behaviour policy** – all children now have individual star charts with rewards and are issued specific and appropriate sanctions to their negative behaviour. The children also have new attitude to learning targets each half-term.

• Updated vision statement – new vision and values reflect current expectations.

• **New assessment system: Learning Ladders** – teachers have a deeper understanding of what pupils have achieved and what they need to do to progress further.

• **Introduced one longer playtime rather than 2 shorter ones** – this has improved the structure of the day and provide a better playtime experience for the children.

• **Moved library from old School House to middle room** – books are now in a central area for all pupils to access and the environment is more aesthetically pleasing.

• Additional and improved display boards – additional display boards in the hall and more children's work is now displayed throughout the school. All classrooms now have working walls for English and Maths which support children's learning.

• **Introduced Chenies Achievers Board** – *pupils' achievements outside of school are celebrated in the school's main corridor.*

• **Restructured Friday letter** – pupils' achievements are now recognised in the Friday letter, including class attendance figures, Maths Whizzer, Star Learners, Star Chart Certificate achievers and Stars of the Week. Highlights of the week show what has been achieved.

• **Introduced Star Learners book** – pupils who have excelled in their learning have their names entered into the Co-head's book and are celebrated in assembly and in the Friday letter.

• **Invested in a keypad entry system** – ensuring we are in line with current safeguarding expectations. Changes were made to timings of the unlocking of gates following parental feedback.

• **Refurbishment of toilets** – much needed refurbishment is underway and due to be completed very soon.

• **Close monitoring of attendance** – Attendance concerns are addressed with individuals which has resulted in improvements in pupils' attendance. Termly certificates are given to 100% attendees.

• **Introduced Open Start throughout the school** – pupils can engage with morning activities with a maths challenge focus and be ready for the school day promptly which provides children with opportunities to complete additional maths challenges.

• **Changes to guided reading** – sessions are now daily rather than weekly, teachers now hear every child read each week.

• **Introduction of English carousel activities** – *children are now completing handwriting, grammar, guided reading and spelling activities daily*

• **Re-Introduction the of handwriting policy & competitions (National and internal)** – handwriting now has a higher priority and there is now a consistently applied style throughout the school with the children now having improved handwriting.

• **Changes to phonics** – a newly appointed phonics lead has improved provision and structure of phonics sessions. New resources have been purchased through PTA funds to support pupils' learning.

• **Launched Morning Activity Club** – supports parents' childcare arrangements in line with parental feedback.

• **Organised Chenies Challenge Days** – an opportunity to further develop children's problem solving skills and reasoning in Maths

• **Changes to home learning** – as a response to parental feedback, we have reviewed and made changes throughout the past 16 months to the provision of home learning eg. added a weekly writing task, reduced half-termly tasks, provided children with the option to develop their own tasks etc.

• **Implementing external support** – through detailed and effective monitoring and evaluation of Teaching & Learning as well as Behaviour and Expectations, we have identified areas of development and proactively sought support from external providers which has resulted in further improvement and development.

• Organised Show Racism The Red Card initiative – we have been concerned about an increase to the number of racist incidents which have occurred this term in KS2. The children will be experiencing the Show Racism The Red Card workshops in the spring term to address their understanding and attitudes.

Hindu Temple visit

I was delighted to accompany the school last week to the Hindu Temple on the outskirts of Watford, situated on the house and grounds formerly owned by George Harrison.

We had such a warm welcome and were given a very informative and structured visit.

We visited the farm to see the cows, being transported there and back in a cart pulled by oxen. They use the milk and make butter, cream and yogurt too. We also visited a garden area. In the house we removed our shoes, then were told about the main characters in Hinduism. The children had done preparation work in school so were able to reinforce their learning through this. Some were dressed in Indian dress as the main characters and their wives. Then they all had an opportunity to dress and have face paints.

We visited the temple area towards the end of their formal prayers, so sat quietly to observe.

The room was then prepared for lunch and we shared a delicious vegetarian lunch of rice, a mild curry, flat bread and chips, a great hit.

We were looked after throughout by a very caring team of people with great experience in handling school groups. The children were very excited to take part in all the activities but were very well behaved throughout. Well done, Chenies!
