Phonics: Please continue to work through the Jolly Phonics sounds, practice segmenting and blending to read and write CV and CVC words. This week we will continue to reinforce... I II f ff s ss c k ck j v w x y z ch sh th ng nk and introduce qu ai ee igh oa oo.

Tricky Words: Set 1/2/3/4/5 on the high frequency list – Please work with the children to consolidate these.

Maths: Counting: Ordering and Recognising Numbers to 5/10/15/20

Counting on from a given number.

Looking at the value of a number and matching objects

Shape: Reinforcing the names of 3D shapes and reinforcing vocabulary to describe the properties.

Money: In our snack shop we are encouraging the children to pay for their snack using different coins.

Days of the week

Topic: This term our topic is Healthy Me. The children will be learning about keeping healthy, a good diet and personal hygiene.

This week the children will be thinking about how germs spread.

Monet Class News

Next week Monet will be making comparisons to where we live and houses and homes in Africa. They will be learning about the geographical features of Kenya. In art they will be doing observational drawings of Kenyan landscapes and the animals that live there.

In science we will be learning about animal habitats and microhabitats and we will be looking closely to see what's happening to our brown trout eggs that we are responsible for this term and making sure that they have a suitable habitat to hatch in.

In English we will be continuing our work on traditional tales and learning new versions of Jack and the Beanstalk and other fairy tales. We will be putting ourselves into the shoes of different characters and thinking about their thoughts and feelings.

In Maths we will be looking at numbers.

Year 1 will be estimating and comparing numbers and learning to use place value to understand what each digit in a 2 digit number means. Year 2 will be rounding to the nearest 10 and finding halves and quarters of numbers.

Hockney Class News

Next week we will explore the book "The Lost Thing" by Shaun Tan, using it as the basis for some creative writing.

In Maths they will continue learning about and using fractions.

In Science the children will look at freezing point of water and conduct an experiment involving that.

In History, the children have started to learn about the Anglo-Saxons, and we will be continuing looking that the life of the Anglo-Saxon invaders and settlers.

In Geography, children will continue learning about earthquakes and how these things are linked to the movement of tectonic plates.

In PSHE the children will be learn more about their brains and how to be mindful in their environments.

Hepworth Class News

English

Next week we will be using our Science and History knowledge to complete some writing that links in with what we have been learning in these subjects. We have been learning about inheritance and evolution in Science and about the Mayans in History. We hope the children are able to apply their learning effectively to produce some great pieces.

Maths

Our work on fractions continues next week with us learning how to multiply fractions. The children have done well with their learning - some of the children are so quick at spotting equivalent fractions due to their solid knowledge of their tables, and this really helps them to solve problems when working out how to add or subtract fractions that have different denominations!

Topic

We are continuing our work on the Mayans - finding out more about their everyday life. Basketball and gymnastics will continue next week. Please ensure all kit is named. The children created websites this week with Mr. F - these will be deleted in due course so do let your children show off their work (password protected).

Science

We will complete our unit on evolution and inheritance next week. In our lessons we will examine fossil records to draw knowledge from them before using all that we have learned to create our own animla or plant which will have adapted to suit its environment.

This week every child bought another copy of the Year 5 and 6 spelling words home. These should be being learned alongside their weekly spellings.

When each child leaves Year 6 they should be able to spell and use these words in their writing, alongside the Year 3 and 4 spelling words. We would appreciate your support in helping your child think about these- maybe take just a couple a week and ask them to spell the words at different times.
