## **Parent Consultations**

Parent Consultations are taking place again on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> March. Meetings will take place in the School Hall; all children's work will be on display in Sprites Classroom. Each appointment is ten minutes long; the teachers do their very best to ensure they keep to time. If parents need to bring their children with them, we request that they are kept in the hall and supervised by parents and not left alone in the school grounds. Each year we have a number of parents who forget to attend the appointment they have made; please ensure that you know what day and time your appointment is and arrive five minutes beforehand.

Please don't leave any valuables in your vehicle when visiting the school.

### **Snow Days**

If by chance we get snow this year, please be assured staff will do their very best to get to school. Many staff live up to 20 miles away, on hills and / or remote areas – making it very dangerous for them to travel. In these circumstances, we hope the school will remain open, but may run on a skeleton staff; the normal curriculum will not take place. Alternatively we may opt for a later start to the day. For those children whose journey is not safe, activities can be accessed via the VLE. We will keep you informed via our text service. Details can also be checked on the Bucks CC website. In snowy conditions, please ensure that your child is dressed suitably for the playground – this includes having a second pair of shoes to be worn outside, such as Wellingtons; tracksuit bottoms / waterproof trousers; gloves, hat and scarf. You may wish to send your child in with spare socks or tights. We do go out to play in the snow, however, they will not be allowed out if they are not appropriately dressed.

### A letter from Mrs Pulfreman in Uganda:

## Dear Chenies School

I visited a village school yesterday, travelling across Lake Bunyonyi in a boat to get there. We had to climb the hill to reach it, quite hard work in the heat. We bought 30 exercise books in the tiny village shop to give to one class, costing 9000 shillings (£2). The children were all very polite, they are all learning English. Some walk up to 8km (5 miles) to get to school, but have no shoes! The little ones only stay for the morning, the older ones until 5 o'clock. Some children sang for us, the oldest ones were in the middle of a maths test! The school gives the children a bowl of porridge at lunchtime as the children were falling asleep in the afternoon through hunger! You are so, so lucky at Chenies. These families are very poor, living in tiny houses, and farming on steep mountainsides. They have no roads, just earth tracks. They children will go to secondary school if they are lucky, but most will stay at this school until they pass their exams at 13 or 15 or 18, depending on how long it takes. Then they will work in the fields with their families. What do you hope to do? Work hard and you can choose. They can't. Love from Uganda.
