INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS

Sprites:

Phonics: Next week the children will continue to work through Phase 2 and Phase 3 and consolidate sounds learnt to date. They will use their knowledge of phonics to segment and blend to read/write new words across all areas of learning.

Some of the children are learning the diagraphs <u>ch</u> <u>sh</u> <u>th</u> <u>ng</u>. You can help your child by reinforcing the difference between the two 'th' sounds 'th – <u>the</u>, <u>th</u>at, <u>then</u>, wi<u>th</u> & <u>th</u>em' and 'th (not f) – <u>thin</u>, mo<u>th</u>, <u>thick</u> & <u>th</u>ink'.

Our tricky word focus, this week will be z not s: is, as, has, his & was

Literacy: We are learning about stringing a sentence together. The children are given a picture or a set of cards as a prompt *e.g. a cat sitting on a mat*. They count the number of words (six) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words.

Maths: We have started to work on addition by counting on from a given number using a range of apparatus. We will also be touching on measuring as a part of topic.

Topic: We are going to be learning about Chinese New Year and comparing different celebrations.

<u>Reading Books</u>: Please could you ensure that your child has their reading book and record in school everyday so that we can record when a member of staff has shared with them. Also, please encourage your child to be independent and encourage them to put their reading folders in the tray every Tuesday/Friday so books can be changed.

Phoenix

In Phoenix class this week we will be using our own ideas to write a story about an adventure and making our writing interesting using adjectives and interesting verbs.

In Maths we will be looking at two digit numbers and what each represents. We will be finding halves, quarters and thirds of some numbers and using known facts to find answers.

Our area of learning this week and for the next few weeks is POTATOES. We are thinking about how they grow. We will be putting our seed potatoes in different areas around the school to see where they grow best.

Pegasus

Next week in English we will be planning and writing a mystery story. The children will be using the Ottoline and the Yellow Cat book as guidance in planning their thrilling tales.

In maths we are going to pause looking at decimals and start looking at measurement, converting them (e.g. metres into kilometres) with the aim of revisiting decimals within the context of measurements.

Pegasus will continue learning about the Tudors. They will be looking into the lives of people during the Tudor times. In science we are going to continue experimenting with sounds. The children will be tasked with researching and designing what makes the best sound-proof box, using a variety of materials.

Griffin

English

We will be continuing our poetry unit of work next week. We will particularly focus on the use of metaphors, figurative language and how to represent moods within poems. Our learning will then be put into practice to compose our own poems, by planning and learning to draft and redraft.

Maths

Our focus next week will still be fractions. We will begin to look at the equivalents of fractions, decimals and percentages. We will then continue to learn about fractions and how to multiply them by whole numbers, unit fractions and non-unit fractions.

The class have not been given written maths homework this week; they have work on Activelearn to complete along with continuing to learn times tables.

Topic

This week the children have written wonderful poems about the Northern Lights after we learned about them and looked at pictures - the children were fascinated! They will write their poems up and create a background sketch of auroras, before exploring these further within art. We will then begin to look at climate change. We will discuss what it is, how it is occurring and the implications and effects on the polar regions. In science the children will continue to classify the leaves they collected.
