Van Gogh Class News

This week the children have been learning the properties of 2D shapes and are growing more confident with using different coins to pay for their snack.

Reading

As the children are becoming more confident with their reading, books we will now be changed on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Even though we encourage parents to read every night with their child, please do not rush through the books. We are happy to change the books as and when your child had finished reading them. Please remember to write a note in your child's reading record every time you read with them.

<u>Phonics</u>: Please continue to work through the Jolly Phonics sounds, practice segmenting and blending to read and write CV and CVC words. Monet Class News

This week Monet will be continuing their topic work on Abodes.

In literacy they will be writing recounts of what they see on a nature walk and what creatures are living in the school grounds.

In phonics year 1 will be learning phase 5 sounds ay, ou, , ie and ea and learning to read tricky words oh, their and people.

In Maths Year 1 will be recognising the value of coins and using coins to add and subtract and to solve problems. Year 2 will continue to use number facts to add and subtract 2 digit numbers.

In science they will learn about the materials used for buildings and why certain materials are used for different purposes.

In geography they will be learning about where we live and the countries and capital cities of the UK.

In art and DT we will look at making miniature models of houses and rooms. Please could your child bring in a bag of recycled materials - different size and shape boxes, toilet rolls, pots etc for joining together to make miniature buildings.

Hockney Class News

In Maths next week the children will continue to focus on learning strategies and methods to solve division problems and multiplication problems.

In English, the children will continue to exploring what the features of legends are as well as further developing their descriptive writing skills.

In Science the children have started looking at the states of matter, having learnt about what solids, liquids and gasses are.

In History, the children have started to learn about the Anglo-Saxons, and we will be continuing looking that the life of the Anglo-Saxon invaders and settlers.

In Geography, children will continue learning about geographical features such as volcanoes, and events such as earthquakes and how these things are linked to the movement of tectonic plates.

In ICT children will continue learning how to code and sequence their instructions in order to get the result they want, and how to debug if they do not.

In PSHE the children will be learn more about their brains and how to be mindful in their environments.

Hepworth Class News

English

The children will be continuing with their work based on the e-book 'Animals on the Move'. They are working on producing written reports based on the migration of animals and have combined research and notemaking to draft and begin their reports which they will continue with next week, before using their editing skills. The children will also be working on their grammar skills - looking at tenses and recognising different tense forms. All the grammar we have been working on builds into the writing process; please encourage your children to explain what they know and how to use these elements, when they are referred to in homework.

Maths

In Maths we will begin the week looking at division of decimals numbers. We will then move onto scaling up and down, using multiplication and division. Towards the end of the week we will be applying the hard work that the children have put in over the past few months in their work on the four operations and we will completing multi-step word problems that use all four of these operations.

Science

Our unit about evolution and inheritance has begun well. Next week we will focus more on the adaptations made by plants and animals to survive. We will then design our own animal with different characteristics needed to survive certain conditions.

Topic

The children will be continuing to find out more about Mexico by looking at some of the fiestas and the human geography behind these. We were particularly pleased with the children's willingness to try the guacamole that they made this week and with the enthusiasm they put into making it. Recipes have been sent home should they wish to make it again with you!

In PE we are continuing with Basketball and Gymnastics.

If the weather continues to be wet and miserable, the Natural History Museum in either Tring or London is a great place for the children to find out more about some of the animals they have studied in English and also links to our work in Science!
