## **Headteacher's News**

I would like to start this newsletter by thanking all of the staff in school who have worked hard to ensure that our new routines have run smoothly and ensured a positive start to the school year for all our children and also to you as parents for cooperating fully with our new ways of working. It has been a pleasure this week to welcome our new children to Van-Gogh. They have all settled incredibly well and enjoyed playing with new friends as they get to know each other. There has been a calm and purposeful atmosphere throughout school this week and I am very proud of how the children have responded to completing their assessments. They have all been expected to do a lot of work, much of which has been completing paper-based questions, rather than the motivating and inspirational collaborative learning that we usually like to provide!

#### **Staggered Start and Collection Times**

This is due to the fact that if I find the system does not improve or indeed makes it worse we may need to change it back again and I recognise the difficulties caused by constantly having to change arrangements.

#### Library and School Reading Books

I would like to thank the PTA for paying for us to upgrade the school library system. This will mean that children will have access to the catalogue from home and during the next half term we will be developing how we use it to support your child's reading. Mrs Wilson has informed me that currently we have over 200 library books overdue and a significant number of reading scheme books outstanding as well. I should be grateful if over the next week you can please search at home and return any books to school next Friday.

#### Homework

Class teachers will not be setting specific home learning tasks this week but we would like the children to read every day. They can read their reading scheme book if they have one, or a book of their own choosing. Why not start a family reading time and all sit down together and read as a family. It is important that your children see you as positive role models when it comes to reading.

## Monet

Monet class have had a super start to the new term and are settling in to their new class beautifully.

English

In English we will be sharing, reading and retelling our favourite fairy tales focusing on 'Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs'. We will be thinking about the characteristics of the months of the year and working hard to punctuate our sentences correctly.

#### Maths

We will be ordering and comparing numbers to 100, estimating and counting objects by grouping into 10s and counting on and back in 5s and 10s.

#### Торіс

We will be finding out more about the artist Claude Monet (when he was born, where he lived, important events in his life, etc.) and begin artwork based on our waterlily sketches. We will be finding out about how humans change as they grow, how to be a good friend and think about people who are special to us. We will continue to learn our song, 'A Little Bit of Kindness'.

## Hockney

The children of Hockney have made a fantastic start to the year and have settled in nicely.

#### English

In English, the children will start their fiction unit, focusing on the book Ottoline and the Yellow Cat. In this they will be practicing their reading and comprehension, as well as working towards writing a mystery. Next week the children will be focussing on comprehension as well as looking at the different types of clauses.

#### Maths

In Maths, we are starting by looking at numbers and place value. The children will learn to find the value of a digit in a number, as well as using their place value knowledge to order and compare numbers.

#### Торіс

Our topic work this half term will be looking at Britain's history between the Stone Age and the Iron Age. The children will start by looking at timelines and understanding where we get our information about this era from.

#### Science

In science the children have started and will continue looking at rock. So far the children have learned that rocks can be categories as igneous, metamorphic, sedimentary and man-made. Next week they will have a go at group rocks based off of their properties.

## Hepworth

We are really impressed with all the children in Hepworth Class.

They have all joined us with a fantastic attitude, looking smart and ready for life this school year, as a Year 5 or 6 child.

They have sensibly approached the assessments we have set this week, which we have assured all children were being used to help us know where to begin our teaching - they are not a reflection of the children and their work during the past few months!

Next week we will begin our curriculum properly.

#### English

We are beginning a non-fiction unit next week, where we will be exploring written reports and learning about the features they have. Our work next week will be based around comprehension; retrieving information and drawing out key ideas and facts.

#### Maths

We start the year in maths focusing on Number and Place Value, which will be our focus for the first few weeks of term. The area of this topic we will be working on next week is reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers. For year 5 we will look at up to 6 digit numbers, year 6 will work on numbers with up to 7 digit numbers.

#### Other subjects

We will begin our topic next week by learning about Greece. We will be locating the country and where it lies in relation to other European countries and we will explore other geographical features in Greece.

In Spanish we will be learning different greetings that we can use - maybe your children will say good morning or goodnight in Spanish to you next week.

In Science we are learning about Earth and Space and we will be starting to look closely at the solar system.

PE will include our sports skills with Mr Malik on Wednesday and a session doing fitness development with Mrs Wilson on Friday. Please remember your child will need to wear their PE kit to school on these days.

In PSHE we will be finding out more about how to discuss issues respectfully, how to listen to and respect other points of view and how to constructively challenge points of view they disagree with.

Our RE lessons are about pilgrimages this term and we will be discussing their own journeys in life as well as religious journeys that different people take.

#### Reminders

Year 6 will have Forest School on Monday afternoon. They need to be wearing trousers and may get a bit messy!

The only set homework at the moment is to read daily - we expect at least 5 entries in reading records each Friday - and to learn any times tables they are unsure of.
