Today you are going to explore some of the text and then plan some writing, which you will do tomorrow.

L.O. To plan writing from the viewpoint of a wolf
1. Reread parts of the text
2. Think carefully about the viewpoint
3. Refer to list of 'things to consider'
4. Create your plan so that it will help you write tomorrow

Take another look at pages 7-19.

Whose viewpoint is presented to you? How is the narrator doing this?

By hearing the wolf's thoughts we see the boy through his eyes – what else does the narrator allow us to see, share and think?

Read page 32 again. *What does the last paragraph say about Shiny Straw? Whose viewpoint is being given?*

What about the last character on page 33?

Choose one of the wolves as the focus for your writing tomorrow; either Blue Wolf or Shiny Straw.

Today you are going to plan your writing from their point of view.

You will need to consider:

- Their life
- Their family
- What they think of human beings
- Information given in the story
- Vocabulary you will use – make a note of adjectives, adverbs, year 5 and 6 spelling words, synonyms
- Punctuation you could include

You can plan your work in any way that works best for you – but remember, it is just a plan.

You do not need to write in full sentences. You are note making, so that tomorrow you can use these thoughts to write.
