Phonics: We will be learning and consolidating sounds in Phase 2 and Phase 3. The children will be encouraged to use their knowledge and understanding of phonics to segment/blend to read and write across all areas of learning.

Literacy: We will be continuing to learn about stringing a sentence together **e.g. the dog is white**. They count the number of words (four) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. We will also be talking about nouns – verbs – adjectives. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words independently.

Maths: We will be re-visiting different areas of maths to consolidate learning.

Topic: Growing – We will also be keeping a 'Bean/Cress Diary' and looking after the plants in our outdoor area.

Phoenix

In Phoenix class next week we are thinking about imaginative language and extending vocabulary. We have printed a seascape and we will add some collage pieces to create natural and human features.

In Maths we will be thinking days of the week and months of the year, making sure we know the order and how to spell them.

Pegasus

Next week in Maths we will continue recapping the four operations by looking at methods of working out addition and subtraction. We will also carry on with practising methods of problem solving.

In English we will be "Word Detectives", looking at the words in the English language and their quirks and spellings, as well as their etymology.

Year 4 will be going to the stables on Tuesday and the Year 3 children will continue with their gardening and cooking, dependent on the weather.

In topic we will continue looking at the history of fashion and clothing in Britain since 1066, focussing on the "flamboyant and puritan" styles of the Stuarts. We will also continue looking at habitats by looking at rainforests and their importance to life on the planet. In ICT the children will continue with their animation project

Griffin

In Griffin next week we will be increasing our production work with a daily rehearsal. Every child has been asked to spend time (as homework) to learn their lines and their cues. They have also been encouraged to consider the characteristics and mannerisms of their production role.

The Community Card scheme ends for Year 6 on Monday - when they must hand in their cards. If they haven't already, a visit to a library over the weekend or going to a community event (for example a fete) can gain stickers for those that need them.

Year 6 will also be holding a bake sale after school on Wednesday and each child has decided what they are going to provide (home-baked / bought). The bake sale is to raise money that they will donate to the Alzheimer's Society as part of their Inter-generational sticker.

We will spend time focusing on our 'Scream Machine' topic next week. The class will work on a design for their own theme park ride. Their maths focus alongside this will be to investigate and work on the real-life problem of running a theme park. We will also continue our ancient Egyptian work and our science work relating to forces. We will be looking at the effects of friction and investigating this. The children have an ongoing project that they will be working on where they are finding out more about UK rivers, worldwide rivers and the features of these.

Year 6 will have the next session of their PSHE/Sex Education session later in the week.
