Note from Mrs Dinwiddy - Bursar

Each term all schools have to complete a census from which information is taken from our school Database. It is important this information is correct, as our funding is based upon the data collected. I would therefore be grateful if you could read the following carefully and, if your child comes under any of the categories and you think we may not be aware, kindly contact us immediately.

Free School Meals:

Regardless of which year your child is in, if you are in receipt of the benefits mentioned in the Free School Meal attachments please notify us by completing the form attached by **Tuesday 8th January** and we can check for eligibility. Any child who comes under the category of free school meals creates extra funding for school and may be entitled to half price trips and clubs.



School Meals:

The number of free school meals taken on census day (January 17th) is recorded and affects our funding. If your child is in Sprites or Phoenix or if your child is entitled to free school meals, we would appreciate it if you could order a meal for your child on January 17th.

Post Looked after Arrangements:

School receives additional funding if a child was looked after immediately before adoption and that child may also be entitled to free school clubs etc. We would ask for documentary evidence of this.

Class News

Sprites

Phonics: Next week the children will continue to work through Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds focusing on segmenting and blending to read/write new words across all areas of learning.

Literacy: The children will be writing about their favourite Christmas present. The children will be encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words or sentences using their phonic knowledge.

Maths: We will be recapping the names and properties of 2D shapes, going on a shape hunt around the school and creating our own shape patterns. We will also introduce some 3D shapes (sphere, cylinder, cube and cone).

Topic: Our topic over the next few weeks is transport and we will be applying our knowledge and understanding of 2D/3D shapes and using different construction materials to create models.

Phoenix

In Phoenix class next week during Literacy we will focus on making banks of words – nouns, adjectives, verbs and adverbs and look at how to change root words by adding different suffixes – e.g. ing, est, and ed.

In Maths we will be continuing to work on *Number/Addition and subtraction*, building on previously learned skills.

Our area of learning next week in topic is WINTER, the changes we might observe at this time of year and how we respond to them (ie the clothes we might wear and the activities we might take part in).

Pegasus

This term in Pegasus we will be finishing off the last bit of our Roman history and move on to our new topic, The Tudors. Over the term we will be looking at who they were, why they were important as well as looking at the lives of people during those times. In science we will be moving on to our next topic of sounds, learning about what sounds are exactly and how it all works. In English we are going to focus on different forms of writing, both fiction and non-fiction, and in maths we will be finishing off our work on calculations and moving on to things like fractions, decimals, percentages etc.

Next week in English we will start reading our new focus book "Ottoline and the Yellow Cat" by Chris Riddell. The children will be able to discuss what they read and make predictions about what they think will happen, based on evidence from the text. We will also look at identifying main and subordinate clauses and conjunctions that link them.

In maths we are going to finish looking at division. By the end of the week, the children should have both mental and written strategies for dividing, and be able to divide numbers beyond the times tables, with integer remainders.

Pegasus will start their new topic by looking briefly at the Tudors, discussing what they may already know and what they would like to learn about them, and they will learn the timeline of the Tudor dynasty. In science we are going to learn about how all sounds are caused by vibrations, and they will explore the different ways that they can make sounds with different objects.

Griffin

In maths next week we will be focussing on our division skills and ensuring that we are able to use both chunking and the 'bus stop' method for short and long division in order to solve division questions. We will be learning about remainders and how these can be simplified as fractions. As always, it is important that your child knows their times table facts as these are crucial to speed up the time it takes children to divide numbers. Keep practising these at home.

In English we will be using the text Ultimate Explorers for the next few weeks. This links with the work we will be doing in science about animals and habitats over the next term as well as our geography and history work in topic. In this unit, the children explore the Big Question: What makes someone a great explorer? The children will read the interactive eBook, and use other sources, to research challenges faced by explorers. They will aim to understand and explain different viewpoints and will look for evidence about what qualities successful explorers would need.

On Thursday and Friday this week we have just completed a geography project about volcanoes and earthquakes. Our new topic this term is 'Frozen Kingdom' and we will be making a start to this unit next week by sharing our ideas and putting forward our own questions for what we would like to learn about. To tie in with our topic work, in science we will be starting our new unit of work on animals and their habitats.

Our PE lessons are on Tuesdays and Fridays. Please ensure all kit is named and in school.
