INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS

Sprites:

<u>Phonics</u>: Next week the children will continue to work through Phase 2 and Phase 3 and consolidate sounds learnt to date. They will use their knowledge of phonics to segment and blend to read/write new words across all areas of learning.

The Super hero and Princess tricky words are in the back of the reading records. Please continue to reinforce these.

Literacy: We will be continuing to learn about stringing a sentence together. The children are given a picture or a set of cards as a prompt *e.g. a cat sitting on a mat*. They count the number of words (six) and write one word at a time, saying each word out aloud to help them hear the sounds. The children are encouraged to use sound mats to identify sounds and write key words.

<u>Maths:</u> We will be continuing to work on addition by counting on from a given number using a range of apparatus. The children will also be using money in the role play area. Please help your child to recognise coins and apply them to addition problems.

Topic: We will be continuing with our Food Creation & Chinese New Year topics.

The children have been very excited about the chicks in school. We will continue to look at the life cycle of a chicken.

Home Learning Tasks to be completed by 29th March 2019

Phoenix Class

In Phoenix class we are learning about the life and work of Beatrix Potter. We will be looking at her stories and creating art using watercolour and close observation.

In maths this week we have been looking at fractions of shapes. Next week we will be using arrays to help learn times tables.

In literacy we will be creating stories about animals and using the stories of Beatrix Potter as a starting point for some characterisation.

Pegasus

Next week in English we will be aiming to produce leaflets to present that information gathered about the history of the school. Some children have chosen to take a photocopy of their English books home as homework to do the finishing touches to their work in time for next week. Please remind your child to bring it back on Monday as they will need it for their work.

In maths we are going to continue looking at measurements, looking at working out the area of shapes.

Pegasus will work continue their work on the Tudors focusing on the age of sail. We will also aim to finish the windchimes next week.

Griffin

English

Year 6 will begin the week with assessments in reading, grammar, punctuation and spelling. This will be their final familiarisation assessment before SATs week, which will help us guide our teaching appropriately after Easter, before their tests.

Year 5 will begin the week learning new grammar techniques and focussing on reading comprehension, when we will focus on developing different reading comprehension skills.

Maths

The beginning of the week will see year 6 having assessments - arithmetic and two reasoning and problem solving papers.

Year 5 will be looking at using all 4 operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) to solve missing number and weird problems. The children will then continue their work on shape: learning more about angles in different 2D shapes as well as calculating missing angles.

Topic

We will continue to learn about explorers of the polar regions, with Mrs Palfreman also showing photos and sharing her recent trip to Antarctica with us.

We have singing to continue to rehearse too - it sounds fantastic so far. In science we will continue our work on life cycles - comparing the life cycle of a chick with other animal life cycles and looking at how different they are. The children have really enjoyed having the chicks in school and we have been very impressed with their care and gentle manner when handling them as well as their observations on how the chicks have changed in the short time we have had them.
