COVID-19 Update

You will be aware of the change in guidance from Public Health England relating to individual action if new symptoms are experienced. In summary, if you or your child experiences a new and persistent cough and/or a high temperature (over 37.8 degrees), that individual should remain at home for 7 days from the onset of symptoms. There is no need for other members of the same household to remain at home unless they start to display these symptoms. More government information relating to this is available <u>here</u>. If you need to act on this advice because your child is displaying these symptoms please state this clearly when reporting your child's absence. Children that develop a temperature during school will need to be collected immediately. As stated previously, please reiterate the need for good personal hygiene, as we are doing in school.

Another busy week with the children starting to learn and explore different types of measures and changes in our environment.

Reading

Reading books will be changed Monday, Wednesday and Friday. We have invested in some new books that will also support the children learning their phonics and tricky words. As a fresh start I have included a list of phonic sets within phase 2/3, tricky words and a note for each child with a personal target. The target will be reviewed every couple of weeks depending on how the children progress with their phonics. As a part of the transition process, we will be putting out a tray so that the children can become more independent in taking the reading books/records out of their books bag every day.

Library books this term will be changed every Friday. Please note that your child will not be able to bring another book home until they have returned ones borrowed previously.

Maths: Counting: We will be continuing to look at addition and subtraction using apparatus

Shape: We will be learning about sequencing events/instructions. Measuring

Monet Class News

Maths: Year 1: Learning their number bonds to 10. To add two numbers using their knowledge of number bonds.

Year 2: Adding three single digit numbers. Subtracting 2 digit numbers.

English: To collect information about an unusual location and to write about it.

Hockney

In English, children will move on from Shang China and look at practicing they presentational skills. In Maths we will start to look at working out the areas of shapes, and move on to measuring capacity.

In Science the children will continue their observations of what a plant needs to grow and write their conclusions.

As part of Art/DT, the children will work on designing, making and decorating their own clay pots.

In PSHE, as part of their MindUp lessons, the children will look at optimism, what is it and how to think optimistically.

Hepworth

Maths and English

Next week our year six children will be completing a further round of assessments. These assessments really enable the children to develop the skills needed to give them the best chance possible of achieving the level they deserve in the tests. It enables them to develop their pace, learn how long they need to spend on different question types and continue to familiarize themselves with the types of questions they will be asked.

Year 5 will continue with their normal Maths and English work as a smaller focussed group without year 6. Towards the end of the week, the children will be continuing to learn about shape - looking at angle sums and missing angles.

In English the children will be writing their own stories based on the Alex Rider books that we have been using over the last few weeks. They will be including their character, setting, dialogue, pace and tension writing skills and we look forward to seeing their ideas materialise.

Other Curriculum Areas

We will start our work making Maya masks using mod-roc to develop our art skills.

We are looking forward to having mums and other female relatives in on Friday to join us in class. The children always enjoy this so we hope lots of you can make it!
