I am sure they will also provide inspiration for children to either read one of their books or complete a piece of writing which they might then enter in the Chorleywood Bookshop Writing Competition!

Chorleywood Bookshop Writing Competition

The theme for this year's children's writing competition is friendship. The competition is going to be judged by Cressida Cowell, current Children's Laureate and author of the *How to Train a Dragon* and *Wizards of Once* series which I know many of our children have enjoyed reading. To enter children will need to complete the following tasks:

Group 1 (school years Reception, 1 and 2) – Which character from a book would you choose to be your friend and why? Draw a picture of the two of you being friends.

Group 2 (school years 3-6) – Choose 2 characters from different books. Write a conversation between them as they meet for the first time, get to know each other and become friends. (There is no word limit for this Group but remember that quality is pretty much always better than quantity!)
