Headteacher's News

I would like to begin by wishing you all a happy new year. It has certainly been a fast moving week in school and I would like to begin by thanking all of the staff who have responded so professionally and ensured that our remote learning offer was in place from first thing Tuesday morning, and has worked so effectively. In addition we were also able to open our doors to key worker and vulnerable children on Tuesday morning. We have all been required to change our patterns of working this week, as I know many of you will have been required to do as well. This is never easy but we are grateful for the many positive comments we have received and will continue to listen to your feedback so that we build on what we are offering.

One issue that we have already recognised is that if google meets are at the same time throughout the school it is difficult for members of the same household to access different ones. We are trying to find ways around that and individual teachers will communicate those arrangements to you via the google classroom.

To ensure that the google meets can go ahead with enough children in them and to enable the children in school to maintain contact with class teachers who are working from home there may be some occasions when the children in school join the class google meet sessions. If any parent of a child in school does not want their child to participate in these sessions please contact the school office.

Mobile Data

The government has put provision in place for schools to request increased data allowances on mobile devices to support disadvantaged children who:

- do not have fixed broadband at home
- cannot afford additional data for their devices
- are experiencing disruption to their face-to-face education

If increasing mobile data is not a suitable option for some children, schools can also request 4G wireless routers.

If there is any parent who needs an increase in their data or a router to enable their child to access the home learning please contact me.

Circumstances do change and I would like to remind you that if your child is relying on a phone for their online learning and does not have access to a laptop computer please also contact me as I am able to loan school laptops.
