# **Class News**

## Van Gogh

Thank you to all the parents who attended parents evenings. It was lovely catching up with you all. I appreciate it was a brief overview of where the children are but please remember we are always here to help and support in any way we can.

### **Phonics**

Please continue to reinforce listening to sounds in the environment, rhyme, alliteration (initial sounds), segmenting and blending and sharing books.

To date the children have learnt the following sounds  $\mathbf{s} - \mathbf{a} - \mathbf{t} - \mathbf{p} - \mathbf{i} - \mathbf{n} - \mathbf{m} - \mathbf{d} - \mathbf{g} - \mathbf{o} - \mathbf{c}$ . We will continue to focus on the children recognising/ listening to these sounds within words and trying to segment and blend to read/write them. Please continue to practice oral segmenting and blending with your child, to support their learning and applying of these sounds e.g. please pass be the b-a-g... can you put on your c-oa-t... it is time to go to b-e-d. Then ask them to tell you what sound they hear in words e.g. jam j-a-m, dog d-o-g etc.

Words you can help your child practice at home. Please also remember following the parents evening, you now at what level your child can access this learning. We want the children to enjoy learning and not see it as a chore.

Please remember the children need to segment the words and then blend them to read/write. The words in red are our tricky words which cannot always be segmenting and blended and need to be learnt by sight.

### **Maths**

This week we will be consolidating what we have learnt to date.

### <u>Topic</u>

This week we will continue to talk about Harvest and the importance of sharing food. We will be making comparisons to other countries and also talking about the importance of sharing within the community and those who are in need. The children will be looking at the works of the artist Giuseppe Arcimboldo.

We will also introduce autumn and changes in the environment.

### Monet

The children in Monet Class have had a busy week working on their assessments alongside some fun, practical and creative afternoons. We also loved performing our action poem, 'Nut Tree' by Julia Donaldson in our Harvest Assembly.

Next week in Monet Class we will be exploring and writing our own version of a chosen traditional fairy tale and we will be continuing the theme of harvest in science by thinking about healthy and unhealthy foods, moving on to understanding the importance of hygiene.

In maths we will be consolidating number bonds and using number facts to help us add and subtract, e.g. counting on, using bonds to 10, using doubles, etc. We will also be estimating and measuring lengths. Year 1 will initially use cubes to do this and Year 2 will begin to use cms and metres.

We will be linking our science to computing next week where we will be looking at food related websites. We will be rating them and thinking about how we recognise that a website is appropriate for children.

Please remember to read daily with your child whether it is their reading book, library book or other book of choice from home and record it in their reading diary. It's lovely to see that children are reading other books as well as the books sent home from school. Please also remember to read the poem if you receive one and encourage your child to highlight/colour the sounds we have been learning in phonics during the week.

### Hockney

We have enjoyed our art lesson this week. The children were excited about making their own paint using resources that would be available in the Stone Age. Instead of using brushes, we used sticks and our fingers to paint. We used spices such as turmeric, curry powder and paprika to make different colours. We searched the school grounds for chalk and charcoal to create black and white paint.

In our topic next week, we are going to be finding out about people who lived in the Mesolithic period. We will look at Star Carr, which is an important archaeological site. We will be answering questions such as *What happened to Britain's coastline when the ice* sheets of the last Ice Age retreated? Wat was Mesolithic life like? How do you think we know about this period?

In maths next week, we are going to be focusing on subtraction. We are also going to be revisiting the work we found tricky in our assessments last week.

In English, we are starting our new book called Shocking styles. The children will be retrieving information from the text to answer questions such as: *What role does fashion have in clothing? What are 'accessories'? What does 'over-the-top' mean?* 

Please continue to read with your child every day and record that they have read in their reading diary. The children should be bringing their reading diaries in to school every day.

We hope you have a lovely weekend thank you for all your support.

## Hepworth

We can't believe next week is the last week of this half term - it's flown by!

Well done to all the children in Hepworth Class who have worked their socks off, put huge amounts of effort into their work and behaviour and been kind and helpful. It's a pleasure teaching you all!

Next week in English the children will use their knowledge of the Greek Myths we have looked at together to write their own myth. Then at the end of the week our SPAG focus is on conjunctions and our spelling rule is prefixes bi, cir and ex.

In Maths, we are focussing on mental strategies for addition and subtraction and then finalising our work on multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000.

In PE, the children will add final touches to their whole class dance inspired by the planets, whilst it Science our focus moves onto the moon. Year 6 will have their last Forest School session, whilst year 5 will create a Spreadsheet to help plan an event in computing. Year 5 will also read a poem about the seasons in Spanish.

For our Topic work we are going to be finding out more about ancient Greek democracy. In PSHE we will be learning about consent and what makes a healthy relationship. In music we will continue to work based on Livin on a Prayer - comparing it with Smoke on the Water by Deep Purple and practicing our musical activities learning the notes.

Thank you so much to all the parents that came to Parents' Evening this week - it was lovely to meet you all and have the chance to say so many positive things about your children.
