Phonics

Please continue to reinforce orally segmenting and blending cvc words. It is important that the children are hearing the sounds at the beginning, middle and end of a word. For example, please pass be the b-a-g... can you put on your c-oa-t... it is time to go to b-e-d. Then ask them to tell you what sound they hear in words e.g. jam j-a-m, dog d-o-g etc. It is also important for the children to have a go at writing cvc words.

This week has been rather creative for the children who have been producing Art, Dance, Poetry, Design technology and Music. Next week lessons follow a similarly creative pattern, in between a Cinderella dance workshop, Carol Concert Rehearsals, and 2 performances!

Year 6 will be doing their assessments next week to familiarise them with the SATs papers and to help us identify their strengths and weaknesses. During these, year 5 will continue our English Powerful Poetry Topic as it reaches its conclusion with children listening to each other's poems and contributing to a class poem - joined by Year 6 when they are free.

In Maths, Year 5 will be consolidating their learning from this term and joined by Year 6 after their assessments.

Monday will be the last Forest School session for Year 5s, so Year 6 will be finishing their Spreadsheets using formulae and functions.

In Science, the children will finish their scripts and puppets before performing shadow theatre productions explaining Isaac Newton and Robert Hooke's different theories of how colour and light relate to each other.

On Thursday we have our two Carol concert performances. One is at 2pm and one is at 6pm. Please ensure your child is dropped off and comes straight into their classroom at 5:30pm. Please let us know with as much warning as possible if your child is unable to attend so we can reallocate their lines if needed.

We will also be distributing Secret Santa gifts next week so please ensure we have these by Monday. Please let us know if there are any issues.

Finally, at the end of the week it is Christmas Craft Day where the children will enjoy being in their houses doing 4 different craft activities.
