

Class News

Van Gogh

The children have come back and settled in well.

Phonics: We will in a few weeks start learning a range of digraphs and trigraphs (sounds with two/three letters) which can be tricky and therefore do need to be consistently reinforced so that the children are confidently applying their phonic knowledge to reading and writing words/sentences.

It is also important that we continue to consolidate Phase 2 sounds and work on segmenting and blending, hearing initial/middle/end sounds and rhyme.

<u>Reading</u>: This term the children will be bringing home their reading books on **Fridays** which should be returned to school the following **Thursdays** to be changed. Please ensure that you write in the reading record every time you hear your child read or share a book with them, so that books can be changed. The children will also be bringing home a library book every Tuesday, once again please ensure these are returned the following Tuesday for the children to pick another book.

Writing:

The children are up for the challenge of writing a sentence about the 'word of the day'. Please continue to reinforce segmenting and blending at home to help them be more confident when writing. Also, if you are doing any writing at home, it is important the children are confidently applying their sounds when writing words/sentences. Please continue to encourage them to use finger spaces, a capital letter at the start of their sentence and a full stop at the end. Remember writing does not always mean sitting at a desk, they can write lists, recipes, make tickets, label things etc. it's all about then having a go.

Maths: We will continue to learn about number 6 and 7:

Conservation of a number: Number of objects in a set does not change even when they are moved around.

Composition of a number: Number are made of two or more other smaller numbers involving a 'part' and a 'whole'. Learning to 'see' a whole number and its parts at the same time.

Subitise: Look at a group of objects and realis how many there re without counting.

In addition to this we will be looking at 2D shapes with 6 and 7 sides (hexagon & heptagon) and as we consolidate previous shapes learnt we will be looking at pattens when describing the properties, for example the number of sides and corner are the same. We will also be opening up our snack shop where the children will get the opportunity to buy their fruit and drink by paying for it using 1p 2p and 5p coins.

Topic: Our topic this term is: Chinese New Year - Food from Around the World. Next week we will start our Chinese New Year Celebrations. It's the Year of the Rabbit. We will be learning facts about China and starting to talk about how Chinese New Year is celebrated.

In Monet Class next week we will be continuing to write our own Chinese New Year stories and working on how to check and edit our own writing to improve it. We will also be using the words 'when, if and because' to link ideas in our writing.

In maths, Year 1 will continue to add and subtract, focusing on correct number formation, using the correct mathematical symbols to write additions and subtractions and recognising and understanding the value of different coins and notes. Year 2 will be finding different combinations of coins that give the same amount, finding totals and giving change.

In science we will be identifying materials which have certain properties and in history we will be comparing toys from different times. In DT we will begin to think about and design our own toy with moving parts. Thank you to all those who have brought in cereal boxes. Please check that they have not contained any nuts or seeds before bringing them into school.

We are also looking forward to the multi-skills festival on Tuesday morning at Dr Challoners High School which is always a fun-filled event.

<u>Maths</u>

Next week Year 4 will be completing the multiplication unit, and Year 3 will be beginning our new unit on Area and Perimeter.

<u>English</u>

We will be continuing reading The Iron Man and writing a Diary entry. We will be focussing on our writing and editing our work thoroughly.

<u>Topic</u>

Children have enjoyed learning about the Tudor era and how they lived, next week we will be looking at features of Tudor houses.

In RE, we will be discussing what is important to us and how we can express our feelings and beliefs. In PSHE, we will be discussing our local community.

In Science, children have been continuing to learn about sound. This week we looked at how sound travels and children made their own string telephone to demonstrate it.

In DT, children have been looking at the design and style of Tudor clothing. By the end of the unit they will be aiming to make a miniature item of Tudor clothing.

Well done to Hepworth class who have continued to work hard this week.

Next week in English, we will finish reading our text Oranges in No Man's Land, exploring characters' feelings and looking for powerful words and phrases that add to the meaning of the story. We will be using these ideas when we write our own stories, based on the text, the following week. At the end of the week, our SPAG focus will be on indicating degrees of possibility using adverbs and using modal verbs. Our spellings for the week will be adverbs.

In Maths, we will move on to multiplying and dividing fractions. This is yet another area where the children who don't know their tables will find the work harder as the relationship between numbers isn't quickly recognised. Please do help your child to practice these - chanting them in the car or using some of the readily available games or apps online.

In Topic, we will be exploring mountains and mountain ranges across the world. Our PSHE lesson continues our focus on the uses and safety around using social media. In RE we will be finding out more about how Hindus believe the world was created.

In our Science topic, Forces, we will be looking at water resistance, whilst in Spanish our phonics focus is the sounds for i and ai, and we will be practising greetings as part of introducing and talking about ourselves.

On Wednesday afternoon we will be going to The Amersham School for an afternoon of handball (there won't be a Music lesson this week), so please remember to collect your child from there at 3pm that day.
