We are finally there, and I know that everyone is ready for a break!

The highlight of this week was the Multi Skills Sports Event at Amersham School. The children enjoyed the coach ride, they took the whole experience in their stride joining in with all the activities but most importantly making me and Chenies School very proud. It was also great to see how proud the children were to complete their first piece of writing, which I am sure they will be very excited to share with you on the work share evening in November.

Phonics

Next term we will be consolidating Phase 1 and would appreciate if you could continue to work with the children on their Phase 1 targets. Our key focus will be segmenting and blending to read and write CVC words.

<u>Maths</u>

Throughout we will be chanting numbers to 10/20 and will revisit:

- Number 1 Counting out one Matching numerals to written and spoken numerals Circle (One curved side) 1p coin
- Number 2 Counting out two Representing two Matching numerals to written and spoken numerals

We will introduce: Semi Circle (One curved side and one straight side) – Practical addition (introduce number sentences 1+1=2) Double one equals two – 2p coin (1p + 1p) - Talking about pairs

<u>Topic</u>

Our new topic is Light and Dark. We will be talking about routines and different times of the day. With Fireworks at the end of the first week we will be making our own fireworks and talking about firework safety.

In Maths we will be counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, revising odd and even numbers and finding halves and quarters of shapes. We will be thinking about keeping safe on Bonfire Night and reminding ourselves why we remember Guy Fawkes. We will also be beginning preparations for our Christmas Play!

Hockney

Before we tell you what we are getting up to after half term we just wanted to mention how fantastic the children have been during assessment week. They have worked so hard and been really sensible. We are really pleased with them.

We have a slightly shorter week when we return after half term as Monday will be an INSET day. Our focus in Maths when we return will be continuing to look at adding 2 and 3-digit numbers crossing boundaries using mental strategies and continuing to look at column addition using a number of exchanges.

In English we will be continuing to look at journalistic features of non-fiction writing. We have also begun to study prefixes and suffixes to understand the impact that these have upon the meaning of words. This will be our focus in our spelling, grammar and punctuation lessons for the next few weeks.

In Science we will move on from our study of skeletons and the digestive system to focus on identifying the different teeth that humans have and the functions of each of these teeth. We are focusing on trying to better understand the role teeth play in the overall digestive system and what the impact of not looking after our teeth can have on our overall health.

In PE we have been building up our skills of curling, stretching and control to the point that we can now apply this to using apparatus. The children have begun using the horse apparatus to perform different jumps at a variety of heights. We will begin to incorporate all these different skills to create a sequence.

We shall not be setting any homework over half term. We hope you can all enjoy a well-deserved break and come back ready and refreshed for the new term.

Hepworth

After such a great first half term with the children in Hepworth Class we are looking forward to all that next half term will offer.

The children have worked incredibly hard since September and they are all ready for a well-deserved break over half term.

After half term, we look forward to seeing the children back in school on Tuesday 2nd November.

English

We will move our focus to a non-fiction text called 'What is Blood For?', which will link well with our science unit next half term. We will be developing our comprehension skills of using the text to find answers and scanning for specific information, before exploring the features of a report text. In our grammar lessons we will be looking at linking ideas across paragraphs using adverbials of time, place and number. Our spellings will be homophones and our 5 extra focus words are: medicine, neighbour, rhyme, sausage, scissors.

Maths

Our work on column addition will be completed at the start of the week when we explore using money and solving problems. As the week progresses the focus will move to subtraction strategies and the use of column subtraction method.

Other subjects

Spanish next half term will focus on music. We will begin to explore the Spanish terms used for different music types, asking and answering questions about our musical likes and dislikes. In Science our unit shifts to 'Animals including Humans' with the main focus on how the body functions. Our first lesson will be exploring the composition and function of blood. In computing we will be looking at how to record our own radio advert and exploring the software needed for this. We will also be making a start on our gas mask boxes. In RE we will be looking at whether we can live in harmony even though we are all different. In PE we will be starting our dance unit looking at the Lindy Hop dance which was popular during war times.

We mentioned to the children about visiting the Imperial War Museum in London over half term, as so many of the children have enjoyed the topic. It's free to enter and could be a fun family day out!

We have so many exciting things planned for this upcoming half term.
