Monet Class News

Next week it will be full steam ahead polishing our Christmas play performances in time for our dress rehearsal. Please make sure your child practises their lines at home.

In Maths we will be working on addition and subtraction. Year 1's will be using number facts to 10 and spotting patterns in numbers up to 100. Year 2's will be using number facts and multiples of 10 to work out how to add near multiples of ten.

In Literacy we will be starting some work based on Fictional books Silly Billy by Anthony Brown and Operation Night Monster by Paul Shipman. We will be exploring the characters in the books and discussing how they overcome their worries and fear. We will be writing letters and stories based on their own experiences.

We will begin to discuss Christmas traditions in RE.

Hepworth Class News

Next week is our assessment week. In English the children in year 6 will undertake their reading and SPAG assessments. We complete these half termly in year 6 as this gives the children an excellent understanding of how the tests run and a chance to practice the tests themselves - learning how to pace themselves, deal with harder questions effectively and checking answers. This helps them to feel much more confident when it comes to the SATs in May. The whole class will also do some independent writing which will form part of our ongoing assessment of their writing skills. It is a great chance for the children to show off what they have learned. Year 5 will do some comprehension work as well as editing and improving their writing from this week. We will also begin looking at Anne Frank's diary.

In Maths we will also have assessments for the year 6 children. The children will have the chance to answer a variety of questions in arithmetic and reasoning papers. As we have mentioned previously we have been really pleased with how well the children have worked in maths this term - they have all made good progress with their understanding of number and operations work we have done so far. We look forward to seeing this reflected in their test scores. Year 5 will be recapping and revising the areas we have covered so far.

In Science we are planning and making our own electrical Christmas decoration. We are reaching the end of our time on our Lindy Hop dances - the children are putting together their dance moves to create a routine.

We will continue with practicing our Christmas songs ready for the carol concert.

In RE we will be developing our understanding of diversity in Islam, Hinduism and Christianity.

In Computing we will be designing an air raid shelter to complete in Sketch Up.

If you're looking for something to do with the children at the weekend or in the run up to Christmas, Hughenden Manor have a 1940s themed Christmas event running between now and January. It promises 'wonderful decorations in a 1940s style made by staff and volunteers, with paper chains and pom-poms, lametta and rag wreaths. Re-purposing and re-using materials will be the order of the day, as it would have been during the war. An element of secrecy will pepper the sights and sounds in the Manor, reflecting the top secret map-making work that was carried out when Hughenden was requisitioned by the Air Ministry in 1941. Join a daily Manor tour to discover more about Hughenden's Second World War history."

This could be a great festive opportunity for the children who have loved this topic so much!
