Legends of Football Competition

Forest School

Year 4 will start their sessions on Monday 9th January. Please ensure that children come to school wearing trousers suitable for climbing and with appropriate outdoor clothing, including sturdy shoes. School sweatshirts should still be worn, but preferably an older one rather than a brand new one!

Message for Buckinghamshire's Public Health Team

Following simple steps can help protect children, minimise the spread of illness in education and childcare settings and protect wider communities.

Flu and coronavirus (COVID-19) are <u>currently circulating at high levels</u> and are likely to continue to increase in coming weeks. High numbers of scarlet fever, which is caused by group A streptococcus, also <u>continue to be reported</u>.

Professor Susan Hopkins, Chief Medical Adviser at the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), said:

- It's important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible. If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has resolved.
- Helping children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene is also key, so
 practice regular handwashing at home with soap and warm water. Catching coughs
 and sneezes in tissues then binning them is another simple way to help stop illness
 from spreading.
- Adults should also try to stay home when unwell and if you do have to go out, wear a
 face covering. When unwell don't visit healthcare settings or visit vulnerable people
 unless urgent.

Remember that flu vaccination is still available for all eligible groups and is the best protection against the virus. We have seen good uptake in older age groups but vaccination among young children remains low. Flu can be very unpleasant and in some cases can lead to more serious illness. Getting your child vaccinated protects them and others they come into contact with, and it's still not too late.

Eligible children include:

those aged 2 and 3 on 31 August 2022; all primary school-aged children; some secondary school-aged children

Class News

HAPPY NEW YEAR! I hope that you have had a good break.

<u>Phonics</u>: Next week we will be starting Phase 3 phonics. We will be learning a range of digraphs and trigraphs (sounds with two/three letters). Please note these can be tricky and therefore do need to be consistently reinforced so that the children are confidently applying their phonic knowledge to reading and writing words/sentences.

Week 1	j, v, w, x	We will be introducing letter names
Week 2	y, z, zz, qu	We will be introducing tricky words he and we

It is also important that we continue to consolidate Phase 2 sounds and work on segmenting and blending, hearing initial/middle/end sounds and rhyme.

<u>Reading:</u> This term the children will be bringing home their reading books on **Fridays** which should be returned to school the following **Thursdays** to be changed. Please ensure that you write in the reading record every time you hear your child read or share a book with them, so that books can be changed. The children will also be bringing home a library book every Tuesday, once again please ensure these are returned the following Tuesday for the children to pick another book.

<u>Writing:</u> The children are very excited about writing, they are discovering that they can segment and blend to write simple words and sentences. Please continue to encourage them to write at home, remember they will use their phonic knowledge to spell words and should be praised for having a go.

<u>Maths:</u> We have continued to work on mathematical vocabulary related to addition, learning how to read/write simple number sentences and make up stories using objects and drawings.

This week we will be chanting numbers to 10/20 and will be learning about number 6 and 7:

Conservation of a number: Number of objects in a set does not change even when they are moved around.

Composition of a number: Number are made of two or more other smaller numbers involving a 'part' and a 'whole'. Learning to 'see' a whole number and its parts at the same time. **Subitise**: Look at a group of objects and realis how many there re without counting.

In addition to this we will be looking at 2D shapes with 6 and 7 sides (hexagon & heptagon) and as we consolidate previous shapes learnt we will be looking at pattens when describing the properties, for example the number of sides and corner are the same. We will also be opening up our snack shop where the children will get the opportunity to buy their fruit and drink by paying for it using 1p 2p and 5p coins.

<u>Topic:</u> Our topic this term is: Chinese New Year - Food from Around the World This week we will be talking about celebrations we have already learnt about and look at similarities and differences, comparing Harvest, Bonfire, Diwali, and Christmas. This will lead us into introducing Chinese New Year 2023, The Year of the Rabbit.

Show and Tell

Next week we will start Show & Tell. The children can bring in something of interest or related to the topic that they would like to share with their peers. Please do not send in toys or anything that is of value as the school will not be responsible for any damage or loss. There will be a box out for the children to put their item in for safe keeping.

It has been lovely to see all the children after the Christmas break so eager and happy to return Monet Class. We have spent the last two days thinking about our Christmas holiday and looking ahead with our New Year's Resolutions. I've really enjoyed hearing what the children aspire to do this year.

Next week in English, we will be recapping and identifying statements, questions, exclamations and commands, exploring characters and making predictions in fictions texts.

In maths, Year 1 will be counting on and back to 100, identifying one more and one less than any number to 100 and reading numbers to twenty in words. Year 2 will be revising place value (understanding the value of each digit in a 2-digit number), ordering and comparing numbers using < and > and practising to count on and back in tens from any number.

In Topic (history and art) we will begin our Toys topic by making an observational drawing of a toy. Children are welcome (but do not have to) to bring in a soft toy from home next Monday which will be kept in the classroom at all times but there will be a selection to choose from if they would rather not bring their own in. Please make sure that any toys brought in are labelled, not expensive or too sentimental. We will do our best to make sure they are looked after but obviously accidents do happen. This will link with our science for this term which is materials by identifying and naming different materials.

In DT we will begin to look at how different toys move, in particular books which have sliders, levers and winding parts and in computing we will be experimenting with drawing lines of varying thickness focusing on January trees.

Welcome back to the Spring Term in Hepworth! We hope you had a wonderful Christmas break and a fantastic start to 2023. We've had a lovely start to the term with two days in school - settling back into all the routines and starting our new topics and areas of learning.

Next week in English, we will begin our unit based on the text 'Oranges in No Man's Land' which is a great book and inspires fantastic writing. Our SPAG lesson will be based on expanded noun phrases and our spelling rule will be 'cious' words and words ending in 'ture'.

In Maths, we will be using BODMAS and working through the final stages of long division where we consider how to interpret remainders.

We will be introducing our next Science unit on forces and magnetism. In Music we will start the term by thinking about what part music plays in our world and what it means to us. In computing we will be learning how to animate screens for story telling using Scratch.

Our PE unit this term is Yoga and Fitness and we will begin this next week by focussing on our breathing whilst moving into different positions to stretch ourselves, using a whole body approach.

In RE we will be finding out more about the different beliefs people have about how our world was created after some fantastic discussions this week. Our PSHE lesson will continue on from the great work the children did this week on being safe online. We will also begin

our new topic based on Mountains - finding out more about different mountains and their features.

This term is full of hard work and challenge and we encourage you to support your child with their times tables, reading and completing homework.
