Van Gogh

The children have had a good start to the term. This week we have been learning about Vincent Van GOGH and looking at his painting The Sunflowers. The children took the role of an artist and recreated sunflowers using different mediums. Please come in a look at our amazing art work.

Phonics: We will be introducing the following sounds **S A T P I N** throughout the week and learning how to segment and blend simple words e.g. i-n (in) a-t (at) s-a-t (sat) t-i-n (tin) etc.

Tricky Words: A (a) – a cat on a mat. I – I am going to school. The (the) – the dog is big.

The children will be coming home with a sound mat to help you support them to form the letters correctly and reinforce the sounds.

Literacy: We will be practicing writing our names and learning about rhyming strings (cat, mat....).

Maths: Counting and Recognising Numbers to 5/10/15/20.

Topic: Summer Holidays – Thank you to all of you who have already sent in photos of your summer holidays but we still waiting for a few more. Please remember to send in those snap shots so that we can start on our holiday topic.

<u>Mind Up</u>: Next week the children will be learning about how the different parts of the brain helps with our learning.

Monet

Literacy: We will be using the book 'Class Two at the Zoo' by Julia Jarman as the focus of our learning this week.

We will ask the children to compose sentences orally before writing, sequence sentences to form short narratives and re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense.

The punctuation focus will be on using capital letters for the names of people, places, the days of the week, and the personal pronoun 'l'

Maths:

Year 1: We will continue our learning about partitioning numbers into pairs and recording them in addition sentences. We will be practising counting on from any number and then using counting on to add 1 or 2 to numbers.

Year 2: We will develop an understanding of how \Box can represent an unknown, partition 10 and 20 into pairs and write related addition and subtraction facts. The children will add and subtract 10 to/from 2-digit numbers by using counting in tens, not ones.

Topic: We will be finishing our self-portraits and talking about belonging to different groups

Hockney

On Tuesdays the children will be going swimming, so please remember to bring in the swimming kits if they haven't been brought in already.

Next week in Hockney class, the children will continue looking at place value in maths, and understanding the value of 3 and 4 digit numbers by partitioning them and sorting them into their correct columns. They will also start doing simple addition and subtractions using the place values.

In English we will continue with the book Storm by Kevin Crossley-Holland, focussing descriptive writing, using adjectives and figurative language to set a mood.

In science, the children will continue looking at animals and humans. We will move on from nutrition and look at the skeletons.

In topic we will continue looking at building on geographical skills, looking at contours on a map.

They will be learning about the First World War and how it all started.

In computing, the children are currently learning about online safety. They have already discussed and looked at Cyberbullying and what it means and will now look at passwords and security.

Hepworth

The children have settled into their new class really well for our first week back and have shown us their hard working attitude across the curriculum.

Next week in English we will be continuing to read our text Friend or Foe by Michael Morpurgo. The children have enjoyed reading this so far and we have had some great discussions. The children will be exploring the text further and developing their inference skills. They will also look more at dialogue and formal/informal speech.

In maths we are continuing our work on number and place value. The children will be consolidating their skills including ordering numbers and building on their knowledge of larger numbers. This area of maths gives the children a solid foundation on which to build as we move forward.

We are continuing to find out more about World War 2 in our topic work and in our new Mind Up sessions we will be learning about how to be more mindful in our thoughts and actions. Our science work sees us continuing to learn about blood and we will be practicing some of our art skills with Mrs Wilson. We are planning podcasts in computing and enjoying our PE sessions with Mrs Tillyer and Mr Malik. We will also be having our school council and eco warrior elections next week.
