Class News

Van Gogh

Another great week but you can see the children are starting to get tired as we slowly draw towards half term. The children have tried hard getting used to a more structured timetable and learning. We have continued to practice for the Harvest Assembly which the children are very excited about. We started to talk about autumn and the changes in the environment.

Phonics

We will continue to work on SATPINMDGOC. In line with focusing on **initial sounds** in words and **oral segmenting and blending** (Phase 1).

Example: Initial sounds... Make some 'Silly Soup' and add things around the house that begin with **s**-**a-t-p-i-n-m-d-g-o-c** sound. What things can they find that begins with the initial sound as their name.

Oral segmenting and blending: Pretend you are a robot and sound out words that they can blend e.g. I can see a c-a-t. Can you pass me the m-u-g? Go and put your c-oa-t on. Reverse roles and get the children to segment and you blend the words.

<u>Maths</u>

Throughout we will be chanting numbers to 10/20 and continuing to reinforce:

- Number 1 Counting out one Matching numerals to written and spoken numerals Circle (One curved side) 1p coin
- Number 2 Counting out two Representing two Matching numerals to written and spoken numerals – Semi Circle (One curved side and one straight side) – Practical addition (introduce number sentences 1+1=2) – Double one equals two – 2p coin (1p + 1p) – Talking about pairs
- Counting numbers to 1-6 on a track

<u>Topic</u>

We are learning about autumn and have been talking about the changes in our environment e.g. colour of leaves, weather etc. We have also focused on what some animals do during this time e.g. hibernate, migrate, collect food, wasp die etc.

Please continue reinforce the above as this will support your child's learning at school.

Monet

This week in Monet Class we have been busy reading lots of poetry, practising our subtraction, planning a Science 'smelling' investigation and beginning our self portraits. We also finished our whole class collage of Picasso's 'Self Portrait and Monster' which Monet Class loved piecing together.



Next week in English we will be writing our own poems focusing on verbs and sound effects to describe nouns. In Maths we will be adding and subtracting and looking at word problems, deciding whether to add or subtract to solve them. We will also be practising counting on and back in 2s, 5s and 10s and making sure we know our number bonds to 10 and 20 quickly.

In Science we will be carrying out our investigation to find out whether we can identify things by only using our sense of smell. We have planned how we are going to do this as a class and the children are all very excited to find out!

In History we will find out about Mary Seacole and her involvement in the Crimea War.

Home learning will be on Google Classroom.

Hockney

Next week in Hockney class we are starting a new non-fiction unit The Most Incredible Sport. In this unit, the children explore the big question: *What is the world's most incredible sport?* They will read the interactive eBook, finding information and distinguishing between fact and opinion. Next week we will focus on identifying features of journalistic reports, comparing different types of newspaper reports and listening and responding to a sports commentary.

In Maths we are continuing to focus on addition and subtraction of 2, 3 and 4 digit numbers using different strategies (column addition, column subtraction, partitioning etc).

In History we are going to be learning about what life was like in Ancient Egypt. We are going to be looking at different jobs that they used to do, how they built their houses, how they entertained themselves etc. We are going to be looking at the similarities and differences between our life now and the life of Ancient Egyptians.

Next week in Science we will be moving on to think about our complicated but very important digestive system. We will be identifying and describing the functions of the basic parts of our digestive system, trying to understand how all these functions work together to ensure that we remain healthy. To this end, we will also learn about what happens when a part of this system breaks down or doesn't work as well as it should. This work on digestion will lead us to focus on teeth and the role they play in digestion after the half term break.

We hope you all have an enjoyable and restful weekend and look forward to seeing you next week.

Hepworth

We have had another good and busy week in Hepworth Class. We have been very impressed with how well the class have worked together this week. We've had some children working at home and blending their learning with Google meets, taking part in group work and discussions with us and children in the class so well done to those children as well.

Next week we will be completing some areas of learning ahead of assessment week in the final week of half term.

<u>English</u>

Using all the knowledge we have gained through the story 'Friend or Foe', we are going to plan and write our own stories based on the experiences we have learned about World War two so far. In our grammar lesson we will be revising word classes. Our spellings will focus on prefixes – bi, cir, ex and our focus words are: beginning Britain desperate disastrous existence.

<u>Maths</u>

We will begin our week learning about column addition. We will be exploring calculations where we add together both increasingly larger and multiple numbers. We will also spend time applying our learning to everyday problems. Later in the week we will explore and develop our understanding of square and cube numbers.

Other subjects

On Monday afternoon year 6 will have forest school - please remember trousers and sensible footwear, with uniform on the top half of the body.

Year 5 will begin to make their cushions - Please send in any material that your child would like to use as the cushion base.

In Spanish we will apply our knowledge about food and drink by learning the story of 'La pequeña oruga glutona', the Spanish version of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. Our Science will see use consolidating our knowledge of parallel circuits and developing our own electric systems that could be used to power a room in different ways. In PSHE we will be finding out more about Anne Frank and in PE we will continue with gymnastics. Our RE lesson will include looking at how and why people use places of worship.
