Van Gogh Class News

This week the children have been learning the names of 3D shapes, cube, cylinder, cone, cuboid & sphere.

Reading

As the children are becoming more confident with their reading, books we will now be changed on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Even though we encourage parents to read every night with their child, please do not rush through the books. We are happy to change the books as and when your child had finished reading them. Please remember to write a note in your child's reading record every time you read with them.

Library books this term will be changed every Friday. Please note that your child will not be able to bring another book home until they have returned ones borrowed previously.

<u>Phonics</u>: Please continue to work through the Jolly Phonics sounds, practice segmenting and blending to read and write CV and CVC words. This week we will continue to reinforce $\mathbf{l} \ \underline{\mathbf{l}} \ \mathbf{f} \ \underline{\mathbf{f}} \ \mathbf{f} \ \mathbf{s} \ \underline{\mathbf{s}} \ \mathbf{c} \ \mathbf{k} \ \underline{\mathbf{ck}}$. We will also be introducing $\mathbf{j} \ \mathbf{v} \ \mathbf{w} \ \mathbf{x} \ \mathbf{y} \ \mathbf{z}$ and $\mathbf{ch} \ \mathbf{sh} \ \mathbf{th} \ \mathbf{ng} \ \mathbf{nk}$.

<u>Tricky Words:</u> Set 1/2/3/4 on the high frequency list – Please work with the children to consolidate these.

Maths: Counting: Ordering and Recognising Numbers to 5/10/15/20

Counting on from a given number.

Looking at the value of a number and matching objects

Shape: Reinforcing the names of 3D shapes and introducing vocabulary to describe the properties.

Money: In our snack shop we are encouraging the children to pay for their snack using different

coins.

Topic: This term our topic is Healthy Me. The children will be learning about keeping healthy, a good diet and personal hygiene.

Monet Class News

Next week Monet have an exciting week planned.

They will be visiting the Iver Environment Centre on Thursday. Please make sure they have suitable clothing and footwear as part of the day will be spent outside. Also they need to bring a packed lunch with them. Please arrive to school on Thursday promptly as the coach will be leaving at 9am.

In Maths we will be looking at weighing and measuring things, comparing weights and using standard units of measurement. Year 1 will be estimating and comparing the weight of objects and using units of time to read half past and o'clock. Year 2 will be using grammes and kilogrammes to weigh things accurately and using minutes and seconds to measure time.

In English we will be starting an exciting new unit about fictional fairy stories and using our own knowledge of fairy tales and traditional tales. If your child has a favourite fairytale they would like to read at home time, please bring it in.

In Topic we will be looking at animal abodes and also begin to find out about abodes in different countries, particularly focussing on houses and homes in Kenya.

Phonics for year 1's will be focussing on the following sounds - oy, ir, ue and aw.

Hockney Class News

In Maths next week the children will finish looking at multiplication and division

In English, the children will finish looking at writing descriptively and write their legends.

In Science the children will at the effects of cooling and heating has on the states of matter.

In History, the children have started to learn about the Anglo-Saxons, and we will be continuing looking that the life of the Anglo-Saxon invaders and settlers.

In Geography, children will continue learning about geographical features such as volcanoes, and events such as earthquakes and how these things are linked to the movement of tectonic plates.

In ICT children will continue learning how to code and sequence their instructions in order to get the result they want, and how to debug if they do not.

Hepworth Class News

English

The children will be spending some time next week doing some focussed writing - we want to ensure that children develop the skills of writing with purpose and showing this in the vocabulary, grammar and punctuation that they choose to use. We will also be spending time concentrating on using punctuation correctly and ensuring the children know how to use a range of advanced punctuation as well as consolidating their understanding of the basics.

Maths

Our main focus in Maths next week is fractions. We will work through the week developing our understanding of ordering, comparing, simplifying and equivalent fractions and finishing with adding fractions. Please spend some time helping your child learn their tables - we are aware we keep saying this but it really is crucial to being quicker and more adept in maths work and fractions are no exception!

Topic

In Science we will be looking at some of the evolutionary pioneers (including Darwin) and finding out the scientific importance of their work. In PE we will continue with Basketball and Gymnastics. Having found out about Mexico over the past few weeks, we will now move on to develop our history skills learning about the Mayans.
