Reading:

Please ensure that you write in the reading record every time you hear your child read or share a book with them, so that books can be changed. **PLEASE SEND IN ALL READING RECORDS NEXT FRIDAY AS WE NEED TO UPDATE THEM, FOLLOWING READING ASSESSMENTS**.

Writing:

This term we will be working on writing instructions in different contexts. We will also be encouraging the children to extend sentences by using adjectives and to start using a capital letter at the start of a sentence and a full stop at the end. Please continue to encourage the children to write at home.

Handwriting:

This week the children started cursive handwriting. Next week we will be sending home a sheet showing how letters are formed, please reinforce pre cursive letter formation. DO NOT encourage the children to join letters up. At school we use the term, whooshing in and whooshing out, for example to write 'a' whoosh in, go around the apple and dust away the dirt and whoosh out.

Maths:

Next week we will be learning all about TEN and introducing 3D shapes (sphere). Please note we will be sending home Maths targets specific to your child and would appreciate if you could work on these.

Topic:

The next few weeks is all about food from different countries.

Next week in Monet Class we will be looking at poetry in English. We will be exploring imagery, adjectives, verbs and comparing poems.

In maths we will be focusing on addition. Year 1 will be revising number bonds to 10, working on finding pairs of numbers that total 20, solving additions by showing an aware of pattern, e.g. 7 + 2 = 9 so 17 + 2 = 19 and 27 + 2 = 29

Year 2 will be using place value and number facts to solve problems and solving missing number problems in addition and subtraction.

In Science we will begin to think about how we can carry out an experiment, 'Does grass seed need soil to grow?' We will also be planting our own seeds. Please bring in any unwanted socks for this (any size, paired or odd but please no holes in the toe).

In geography we will be finding out about the key characteristics of the seven continents. In PSHE we will be thinking about how our community can help everybody to feel included and understand that we are all equal while recognising similarities and differences to others.

Please remember to read with your child every day in order for your child to make the best progress and to promote a love of reading. This does not have to be a book from school every day. Please also remember to bring in a water bottle for the classroom.

Hockney

It has been a fantastic first week back for Hockney class! They started their week catching up with each other about their half term holiday and then got straight back to learning.

Maths

Children have continued to show a good understanding of length and perimeter this week. We have been working on taking more time with our working out and checking our work again to spot and correct silly mistakes.

English

Children have worked hard planning their Explanation Text and will be writing a final piece of their writing next week where they will be able to give you information about "*Who killed Tutankhamen?*"

Topic

In, PSHE, we have started our topic on money and we have had a lovely discussion where children have talked about what they know about money and why it is important. Next week, we will learn about budgeting. We will be planning a party on a budget.

In Geography, we have been learning about counties in England. Children have used an atlas to locate the neighbouring counties.

In RE, we will be discussing the difference between a symbol and a sign. We will discuss how symbols can express deep ideas and beliefs.

In Science this week, Year 4 children were learning about sound and vibrations. To demonstrate their understanding, they made musical harmonicas! Were you lucky enough to hear their sounds at home?



In DT, children started to work on their Tudor clothing design. They created some beautiful collages and started to make observations on the similarities and differences of their items.

Please continue to encourage daily reading and help your children with their spellings. Can you also check they know their login details for google classroom.

Hepworth

We have had another busy and wonderful week at Chenies - with the highlight being our brilliant trip to Batchworth Lock. The children were impeccably behaved, and remembered their manners. There was so much to learn about and the day gave the children lots of new experiences. Special thank you to all the adults who helped us - Mrs Walker, Mrs Karim and Mrs Green. Mrs Wilson highly recommends doing a narrow boat holiday if you ever have the opportunity - she did it with her family a few years ago and will be doing it again this year!

Next week in maths our focus will be on scaling, ratio and proportion at the beginning of the week and then 3D shape work on Friday. In English we will be reading more about Ultimate Explorers in preparation for writing our own Explorers' Handbook, whilst in SPAG we will be using colons, semi-colons and commas when writing lists. Our spelling rule will be the prefixes 'in' and 'irr'.

In Science, now that we have seen levers, pulleys and gears in action, we will be making our own devices that capitalise on this simple yet transformative technology. Please remind the children that they may need to bring in their own materials, such as plastic cups/spoons for catapults, or string, 500 ml or 1 litre plastic bottles. They will need them on Monday as Science is back in its usual slot.

In Computing, children will be adding more to their haunted house animation by learning show/hide coding to make sprites appear from nowhere! Meanwhile, in Art children will be using the various mark making mediums that they have learned to make their final Mountain pictures.

Our RE lesson questions whether people have a responsibility to care for the world and our PSHE lesson will focus on understanding more about prejudice and discrimination. World Book Day will be taking place on Thursday where we will have lots of exciting activities taking place.

We would also like to say a special thank-you to Mrs Silverstone for her support with our trout and for doing our session this week with us as well as to Mrs Sahotay and Mrs Powell who came in to feed the trout during the half term holidays. We will be releasing the trout at the end of this term before we break up for Easter.

We wish you a happy weekend - perhaps you might take a walk along the canal and visit Batchworth lock with your child so that they can show you how it works!
