Class News

Van Gogh

Welcome back to a very busy term. I hope you had a good break! Thank you to all the parents who attended the Stay and Read session this morning, we really appreciate your support.

Phonics

The children have started to make progress in these areas, but it is really important that you continue to reinforce listening to sounds in the environment, rhyme, alliteration (initial sounds), segmenting and blending and sharing books.

To date the children have learnt the following sounds s - a - t - p - i - n - m - d - g - o - c - k - ck.

This week we have been revisiting previous learning and introducing our first digraph. The rule we teach the children is that **ck** is often found at the end of a word e.g. s-o-ck c-l-o-ck d-u-ck. This term our key focus is for the children to be able to segment and blend confidently. It is important that they are hearing the sounds at the beginning of a word and the end of a word. Please continue to practice oral segmenting and blending with your child, to support their learning and applying of these sounds e.g. please pass be the b-a-g... can you put on your c-oa-t... it is time to go to b-e-d. Then ask them to tell you what sound they hear in words e.g. jam j-a-m, dog d-o-g etc.

Words you can help your child practice at home.

Please remember the children need to segment the words and then blend them to read/write. The words in red are our tricky words which cannot always be segmenting and blended and need to be

This week the children were introduced to number THREE. Next week we will be continuing to count forwards and backwards to numbers 10/20. We will continue to consolidate one more and one less. Match quantities to objects e.g. 3 apples 1apple 2 apples 3 apples. Write and form number THREE accurately. Introduce the children to our net 2D shape the TRIANGLE – I am a TRIANGLE I have THREE straight sides and THREE corners.

Topic

We are continuing to learn about fireworks, Guy Fawkes and firework safety. It is our Remembrance Assembly on Friday so we will also be introducing Remembrance Day and the importance of remembering those who we lost and those who are still fighting in wars.

Next week in Monet Class we will be busy working on our class Remembrance Poem and practising it ready for the assembly next week. We will also be looking at explanation texts in English and begin to write our own linked to science and our seasonal change topic. We will also be recording the weather, temperature and rainfall each week during November and the beginning of December.

In Maths Year 1 will be counting on to add small numbers and counting back to subtract. We will also be revising 1 more and 1 less than any number to 100. Year 2 will be counting on to find a difference between two numbers with a small gap and solving addition and subtraction number problems using known number facts, e.g. bond to 10, doubles, etc.

We will be focusing on dance this half term in our Friday PE session with the inspiration being fireworks and 'winter wonderland' and in PSHE we will be discussing the difference between happy surprises and keeping secrets.

We will also be working on our script for the Christmas Production. Year 2 will be bringing their lines home to practise but please could they bring them into school every day for rehearsals.

Hepworth

We've had a productive week in Hepworth, and everyone seems to have come back refreshed and ready to learn.

Next week in English the children will continue developing their debating skills, whilst later on in the week they will be working on direct speech punctuation and will have homophones for their spellings.

In Maths, we will be looking at formal, written methods for adding and subtracting numbers with up to 5 and 6 digits, including decimals. We will build on their skills looking at how to solve word problems.

In Science, our focus on understanding light will include making our own periscopes to understand how light reflects off mirrors, and sends the image back to the eye. By angling the mirrors we will be able to see things that are not directly in our eye line. With this in mind we are putting out a request for empty cereal boxes.

Meanwhile, our topic work will include our exciting lesson where we will be tasting foods that the Ancient Greeks would have eaten. Hopefully your children will be able to try something they've not had before! Thank you to the parents who have responded so quickly to the allergy information form.

In PE, the children will be learning more of our Greek-inspired group dance. We will also complete our collage poppies in our art lesson ready for our Remembrance Day assembly on Friday where we hope we can see many of you in attendance.

In RE we will find out about why some Muslims make the pilgrimage to Mecca. Our next PSHE lesson will look at what it means to be attracted to someone and different kinds of loving relationships, as well as learning that people who love each other can be of any gender, ethnicity or faith.

On Monday afternoon, Year 5 will be attending Forest School (please remember they will need to wear their PE kits), so Year 6 will be learning about Spreadsheets and revising weather and seasons in Spanish.
