Uniform Reminder

Please can I remind everyone that full school uniform should be worn on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, and that PE kits should only be worn on Wednesdays and Fridays. In addition please remember that any child with longer than collar length hair should be tying it up and that only stud earrings are permitted to be worn in school. Earrings should either be removed for PE days or if a child is not able to remove the earrings yet they will be required to put tape over them for their own and others safety. I appreciate that as children grow out of uniform obtaining new uniform and in particular shoes is a challenge in these times and I will therefore make allowances if people speak to me about the reason for not having correct uniform. I do however still expect our children to take a pride in their appearance and look smart. I am sure that I can rely on parents to reinforce this message with your child at home. Children who feel unwell

As is often the case when all children return to school we have had a few children feeling unwell. Please can I remind you to follow Public Health England Guidance though and if your child exhibits any of the coronavirus symptoms please get them tested and keep siblings at home as well.

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- **a high temperature** this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

- 1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
- 2. You and anyone you live with should stay at home and not have visitors until you get your test result only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone in your support bubble should also stay at home if you have been in close contact with them since your symptoms started or during the 48 hours before they started.

We will also continue working on the portrait skills in Art and continue practicing their coding language using Turtle Logo.

Hepworth Class have had a fantastic second week back at school. They have continued to work hard on their independent projects and many have produced some very good written pieces of work.

Next week we will be assessing the children in the morning sessions. This will then inform our summer term plans, ensuring that we cover any work that needs to be revisited, following the school closure period, and it will assist us in grouping individuals. We will be assessing maths (arithmetic and problem solving & reasoning), reading comprehension, spelling, punctuation and grammar and independent writing.

We have assured the children that these assessments are for them to show us what they can do, so that we know what we need to teach them in the summer term and they should not feel worried about them. However, a good night's sleep each evening and being fully prepared for each day, will support them in showing us their best.

Our afternoon sessions at the beginning of the week will focus on art. We will be exploring and developing our drawing skills, to produce a detailed drawing of an animal, using the skills we have learned and practised.

Towards the end of the week in science we will be doing some more practical investigative work to find out more about some of the properties of materials, such as their strength. We will also continue with our unit of work on drug safety in PSHE.
