Monet

The children in Monet have had a brilliant first week settling into their classroom, getting to know each other and thinking about how to be a good friend by showing kindness and sharing worries. We've also been making birthday cards for our special birthday box and practising how to write or draw a worry to put into our class worry box.

Next week we will be talking about our favourite fairy tales in English and thinking about features of fairy tales. We will also be carrying out some fun activities for Roald Dahl Day next week. We will be focusing on remembering our capital letters for names and when using the personal pronoun, I.

In maths, Year 1 will be counting and estimating, comparing numbers to at least 20 and reading and writing numbers. In Year 2 we will be identifying any number to 100, understanding that 2-digit numbers are made up of 10s and 1s, ordering and comparing numbers to 100 and reading/writing numbers to 100.

In Science we will be describing how humans change as they grow and in topic/history we will be introducing the artist Monet and begin to put together a simple timeline of his life. We will also be introducing our collage unit in art by tearing and cutting paper/card in imaginative ways and looking at the artist Matisse.

P.E. will be on Tuesdays and Fridays so children will need their PE bags in school for these days and please could your child bring in a water bottle to keep in the classroom every day. Please read daily to your child and give them lots of opportunities for them to read to you (not necessarily reading books although these will be sent home next week) and do a short five minute session on doodle maths each day.

Hockney

We are very excited to welcome the children back to Hockney class. The children have settled in well and are ready to learn, which is great to see!

Next week we are starting a new topic Stone Age to Iron Age. Children will explore the meaning of the term 'prehistory' and identify the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age on a timeline. They will find out what archaeologists do and how they find out about the past without written records.

In maths we are beginning the term by focusing on number and place value. We are going to be looking at thousands, hundreds, tens and ones. We are going to be partitioning numbers in different ways. Please help your child access Doodle maths at home, as it is a valuable resource that will help them immensely with their maths understanding.

In English we are starting with a fiction topic focusing on a story called 'Ottoline and the Yellow Cat'. We will be focusing on in-depth comprehension and trying to better understand the characters and their actions.

We are looking forward to our PE coaching sessions on Tuesdays and French horn lessons for our Year 3s starting on Friday morning. Please note that all children will need their **PE kits** in school for lessons on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

Please support your child in remembering to bring their **pencil case** and **reading record diary** to school **every day**. At the back of their reading diary, we are going to be sticking in children's log in details for Languagenut; therefore, it is important that they have access to it at school.

Hepworth

This past week has been a great time for children and staff alike to get to know each other better, and pupils' behaviour has been very positive, with lots of enthusiasm for the coming term. We are so proud of all of the class for their excellent attitudes to learning and their hard work already.

Next week, Hepworth will begin with reinforcing their mathematical understanding of place value, involving bigger numbers - reading, writing, ordering and comparing these.

In English, the children will be studying the E-book Mission: Save Pompeii, using their comprehension skills at the beginning of the week, whilst in SPAG we will be looking at pluralisation and general grammar skills.

In Science, children will be learning about space which already seems to be an exciting subject for many of them, so we hope it will inspire them all further. This coming week we'll learn about the names and order of the planets, as well as investigate the scientific arguments for whether planets are spherical.

This first half term Year 6 will attend Forest School on a Monday afternoon, so please ensure that your child is suitably equipped for all weathers! This also means that Year 5s will have lessons in Spanish and Computing during that time. (After the half term holiday this will switch over.) In Spanish, the children will be learning more vocabulary about the seasons and weather, and Computing will be about Spreadsheets.

Our topic this term is 'Stargazers' with the science link to space and studying Ancient Egypt. We will be finding out more about this in our lessons on Thursdays.

Our PE this half term will be gymnastics with a focus on bridges and we will do hockey with Mr Jones. PE days are Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

Finally, a reminder that the Year 5/6 Netball Club starts again on Monday 12th September, it runs from after school until 4.15 pm. If your child would like to attend please complete the After School Club letter and send it to the office.
