INDIVIDUAL CLASS NEWS

Van Gogh

This week the children have been learning to segment and blend simple words. We have also been thinking about which part of our brain helps us to be mindful and unmindful.

Phonics: We will be introducing the following sounds G O C K throughout the week and continue learning how to segment and blend simple words using all sounds learnt to date:

E.g. i-n (in) a-t (at) c-a-t (cat) k-i-t (kit) g-o-d (god) m-a-n (man) p-o-t (pot) s-a-d (sad) etc.

<u>Tricky Words:</u> A (a) – a cat on a mat. I – I am going to school. The (the) – the dog is big.

At the end of next we will be sending home a pack to help you start working with your child on phonics, reading and number.

<u>Literacy:</u> We will be practicing writing our names and orally segmenting & blending words.

Maths: Counting and Recognising Numbers to 5/10/15/20 - Days of the week

<u>Topic:</u> Our new topic is Autumn & Harvest – We will be looking at the changes in our environment and learning the importance of Harvest and learning a song for the Harvest assembly.

Mind Up – This week we will taking our Brain Breaks three times a day.

Monet

Literacy: In literacy next week we will be focussing our reading and writing on the story of The Little Red Hen in preparation for the Harvest assembly.

Maths: Year 1 will be adding and subtracting up to 15 and deciding whether to solve word problems using an addition or subtraction sum.

Year 2 will be using their pairs to 10 to work out what needs to be added to a two digit number to make the next multiple of 10. They will be practising adding 10, 11 and 20 in the context of money and solving word problems.

Topic: We will continue our Mind-Up lessons, and finding out how to keep safe online. We will also be exploring the different things people can do which make us feel we belong to a group.

Homework: Some parents have expressed concern that the children have not had any formal homework this half term and I apologise for my lack of communication on the matter. The expectation for homework that Ms Chohan and I have for this half term is that the children will be reading at home and spending time listening to stories being read to them by adults. There is a significant amount of research which shows that children who enjoy reading for pleasure achieve the highest levels of academic attainment in all subjects, including maths. I will be discussing this in more detail at the reading workshop on Monday 14th October but in the meantime please keep reading to your child. They are all working very hard all day in school!

Hockney

Next week in Hockney will be assessment week in their maths and English lessons.

The children will carry on looking at the human body, and running their own experiments based on what they have learned so far. The children will also continue with their autumn leaf art projects.

As a reminder, parents are invited to a guided reading workshop on Monday, aimed to help you move your children's reading forward.

Anyone who does not have shin pads for the Football Festival on Wednesday please can you let us know on Monday.

Hepworth

Next week in Hepworth class we will begin the week with a few assessments. These will focus on writing in different genres, reading comprehension, grammar, punctuation and spelling, arithmetic and reasoning in maths. These are for us to gain a baseline of where all the children are working at in each year group so that we can plan the curriculum according to the needs of the children.

On Monday we are extremely fortunate to be welcoming two war veterans into the classroom to share with us their experiences in the World War II. Our children will gain first hand accounts of the reality of the war, which we will use to later in the week to produce further work from. We will also make our gas mask boxes and identity cards ahead of our visit to Holdenby House on 14th October, along with learning some traditional songs from war times, in order to have a 'sing-song' on our trip. We began our Spanish lessons this week and will continue to practise Spanish greeting next week, leading onto introducing ourselves - do ask your children to say "Good morning," "Good afternoon," or "Goodnight" in Spanish.

In Science we are looking further into our bodies and how our blood supplies us with the things we need, as well as finishing our heart rate investigations.

We are also looking forward to welcoming you to our classroom on Thursday to explore the work your children will do in years 5 and 6, leading towards secondary school.
