Class News

Van Gogh

The children have a great week! We are continuing to learn about rules and routines in the class and around school. They have been building relationships with staff and making friends across the school. We went for our first walk in the woods today, which the children thoroughly enjoyed.

Next week we will be following a more structured timetable and starting Phonics, Maths and our topic for this term.

Phonics

Next week we will revising Phase One, which covers segmenting and blending, rhyme, listening to instrumental sounds and initial sounds in words.

Maths

Throughout the week we will be chanting numbers to 10/20 and introducing:

Number 1 - Counting out one and matching objects to written and spoken numerals.
 Introduce 2D shapes, Circle and its properties, one curved side. Also the value of a 1p coin.

Topic

Next week we will start to learn all about us. We will start to talking about our families and look at similarities and differences.

Reminders:

Tuesday 20th September 2022 will be their first full week. The children can arrive anytime from 8.30am onwards.

Please note that the children do need to be in for registration at 8.55am.

Please do not send in toys with the children as they might lost or damaged.

Monet

Next week in Monet Class we will be continuing our theme of fairy tales by focusing on describing the main characters and asking/writing questions using the correct punctuation. In maths Year 1 will be reading and writing numbers to 100 in numerals and reading numbers in words to 20. They will also be counting on and back in tens from any 1-digit or 2-digit number, e.g. 23, 33, 43, 53... and identifying 1 more and 1 less than any 2-digit number. Year 2 will be identifying any number on a 1-100 grid and understanding that each is a multiple of ten and some ones. They will also be locating any 2-digit number on a 1-100 grid or number line and use this to order and compare numbers with <, > and = signs. They will be practising to count on and back in 10s from any number.

In science we will be describing how animals grow and in history/topic we will be finding out more about Monet and completing a timeline of the main events in his life. In art we will be

experimenting with collage techniques and using Matisse as inspiration to develop our own ideas.

Some children will have brought home some photocopied poems in their reading folder. Please make sure your child reads and practises these at home as they contain all the new sounds that your child has learned or practised in phonics that week. The sounds will be listed at the bottom of the poem for your reference. It would be lovely if you could keep them in a folder at home to read, they do not need to be returned to school and your child could even highlight the sounds learned that week. Any questions, please feel free to speak to me next week. Reading folders need to be returned every Tuesday for books to be changed and new poems handed out.

Please check that your child's clothing has their name clearly written inside. We have found a lot of jumpers and cardigans but it is becoming very difficult to return it to the correct child as many have no name or previous child's name.

I am very happy for children to bring things of interest into school to show but please could they be related to our topic/learning/interesting trip rather than toys.

Homework for Monet Class is to read and be read to daily and to complete five minutes of doodle maths daily.

Hockney

Next week we are going on our school trip to Celtic Harmony as part of our Stone Age to Iron Age topic. We have already looked at Cave art and the children are very excited about our trip. You would have received a letter giving you all the necessary information for the trip so please read it carefully and if you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask.

In maths Year 3 children will be focusing on 1, 10 or 100 more or less than a given number. We are also going to be recognising the place value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones) and solving number problems and practical problems involving these ideas. Year 4 children will be looking at number lines to 10,000 as well as comparing numbers and ordering numbers to 10,000.

In English we are continuing to read our story 'Ottoline and the Yellow Cat'. We will be planning and writing a notebook extract in role of Ottoline. We will be talking about the text we have read so far and trying to sum up all the events in the text.

This week we are going to be setting the homework on Google classroom. Please support your child to log and access it. Maths will be set on **Doodle maths**.

Every child should be able to access it. In case they have forgotten their log in details, here is a little reminder:

<u>Username</u>: first four letters of your name and first four letters of your surname.

For example if your name is **Jonathan Smith** your username will be:

Doodlemaths is a valuable resource that the school has invested in. Please support your child at home to access it. It will greatly improve their mental arithmetic as well as other areas in maths. We are going to be handing out star points every Monday in our class to those children who are accessing Doodle maths at home.

We will endeavour to change reading books every day. We are asking children as they come into the classroom in the morning to change their books if they have read them (we will check the comments section to see if the parent has written a comment saying that the book has been finished).

It's been a very busy week in Hepworth Class and we have achieved so much already! We are so proud of the children's brilliant behaviour and attitude to learning, which can sometimes waver once the initial week is over! Well done children for keeping this up.

It has been exciting to announce house captains, eco warriors and school council members too after our elections this week.

Next Week

Next week in English we are using our text 'Mission: Save Pompeii' to do some comprehension work and note taking. In SPAG our focus is on formal/informal speech structures and our spelling pattern is 'ough'.

In Maths we are continuing our place value work with comparing and ordering numbers as well as negative numbers.

In Science we will be having a more in depth look at the planets, our topic work continues with climate and trade in Greece and our art will continue with some collage and mixed media work.

In PSHE we are looking at ways to participate effectively in discussions online and manage conflict or disagreements and our RE work sees us looking at journeys and special places.

Homework

English is set on a Friday and involves the children writing for 30 minutes using a choice of 4 different types of writing. They need to apply the grammar rule for the week, as many of the spellings for the week and some of the year 5/6 and 3/4 statutory spellings.

All the resources are on Google Classroom, including clear instructions - do take the time to read these in order to support your child and pop to see us after school if this isn't clear.

English homework is to be handed in via Google Classroom (either typed or handwritten and photographed) on Wednesdays.

Maths is set on a Wednesday and will be a range of tasks/games relevant to the learning for that week. If your child does Doodle Maths, they need to complete this every day (or a minimum of 5 days each week) instead of the set homework, in order to achieve their raffle ticket.

(Please note that this week, due to a technical error, the maths homework has gone out on Friday. This is therefore due on Wednesday to allow the usual amount of time to complete.)

If children complete the homework, on time, they will receive a raffle ticket for each piece to be entered into our prize draw at the end of the half term.

Reading should be done for 20 minutes, 5 times a week. Reading records are to be handed in, with comments and page numbers recorded on a Friday in order to receive a raffle ticket for the prize draw.

We hope you are able to attend our curriculum evening next Thursday at 6pm where we will be able to talk to you about the upcoming year in Hepworth.
