# **Class News**

# Van Gogh

<u>Phonics:</u> The children are working very hard on their phonics as we continue to re-visit and consolidate the Phase 3 and Phase 5 sounds and focus on applying these sounds to reading and writing. Please continue to work with your child on the sounds and tricky words.

**Reading:** The children will be coming home with their reading books on Monday and should be returned on Friday. It is really important that you continue to read and share books everyday with the children.

<u>Math:</u> We will continue to consolidate our TEEN number s and talking about place value. We will also be introducing recording data by using tally chart and bar graphs.

**Topic:** We will be monitoring the growth over the next few weeks and keeping a diary. It is the Eid this week and we are very lucky to have Omar and Nisreen in the class to tell us all about it. We will be learning about the celebrations and how it is an important event in the Islam calendar. We will also talking about similarities and differences with Hinduism and Christianity celebrations.

**Role Play:** is currently a Doctors Surgery and the children have been enjoying playing the roles of nurses, doctors, patients, and admin. They have treated sick babies with high temperatures, broken arms and have even had to do home visits. We will keep you updated on how our patients and recovering!

#### Monet

On Tuesday Year 2 will be taking part in a games festival, please can they come to school in their PF kits.

Next week we will be continuing to focus on using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops consistently in our writing and using commas to separate items in a list. We will be reading more of our class book, predicting what might happen and creating linked artwork for our classroom display.

In Maths we will be revising and comparing 3D shapes and their properties, telling the time and solving time related word problems. Please practise telling the time at home over the weekend so the children are confident with o'clock and half past times (moving on to quarter past and quarter to in Year 2).

In Science we will be observing our bean seeds and finding out what is happening to the seeds in different locations of the classroom. We will also be identifying and describing the different parts of plants and trees.

In PSHE we will be talking about medicines including vaccines to help people stay healthy and finding out about the Big Bang Theory in RE.

# Hockney

This week in English we will be finishing our work on Christophe's story by writing a story based on their own experiences, using the book as inspiration.

In maths we continue with looking at measurements, finishing up with perimeter and area, and moving on to time.

We will be starting their Science of Living things and Habitats, by looking at vertebrates, what they are, and how to identify them.

In topic we will continue looking at the Romans. They will look at the attempts of invasion of Britain by the Romans.

In Computing, they are learning how to effectively format a document. They will be learning on how to use the spell checker effectively.

Homework has been set for Maths and English, which can be accessed using their Google Classroom login.

As part of the topic of looking at the Ancient Romans, the children have recapped their knowledge on forces and have started a small project on making mini-catapults. I hope to dive further into this with the children, with the aim of working as a class on building a bigger "person" sized catapult that could launch water balloons. If anyone can help by providing some materials, I would be very appreciative. Things such as scrap gutter piping for the framework, and something like the inner rubber tube of a bicycle wheel. Many thanks in advance.

## Hepworth

On Tuesday Year 6 will be taking part in a games festival, please can they come to school in their PF kits.

Next week, we continue to use the text 'Fantastic, Funny, Frightening as our stimulus for our English lessons. The work will include making predictions, discussing their understanding of what is read and discussing genre. In grammar we will focus on word structure, word types and expanded noun phrases. Our spelling words will be the prefixes in- or irr-

In Maths we will start the week looking at time - this will include reading time, converting between 12 and 24 hour times and reading from timetables. At the end of the week we will be looking at angles around a point, on a straight line and opposite angles.

Our topic work will involve us exploring how the sea shapes the coastline in the UK and this ties in with the class novel we are currently reading at the end of each day, Floodland - by Marcus Sedgwick which the children are really enjoying. In Science, the children will continue to find out more about the changes in humans through to old age. In RE we are doing a final focus on Eid ul Fitr: this is being celebrated this week - so 'Eid Mubarak' to all families who are celebrating! In Friday's PE lesson we will be doing map work as part of our outdoor adventurous activities unit. PSHE sees us continuing our work on discrimination and stereotypes.

Please can you ensure that your child has a sunhat and sun cream on as the weather starts to be a lot warmer and sunnier. We would like to do more outside as it warms up and it is important that your child is protected.
