
## **Breakfast Club**

## **Class News**

## Van Gogh

Hope you have all had a good week!

## **Phonics**

The children are doing well with segmenting and blending, hearing initial/middle/end sounds and rhyme. We will continue to consolidate Phase 1 and would appreciate if you could continue to work with the children on their Phase 1 targets.

To support reading the children will be learning to sight read the tricky words alongside the sounds. Please use the material sent home last week in their reading pack to continue to reinforce these.

## Maths

We have continued to work on mathematical vocabulary related to addition, learning how to read/write simple number sentences and make up stories using objects and drawings.

This week we will be chanting numbers to 10/20 and will be consolidating number four and introducing number 5:

**Conservation of a number**: Number of objects in a set does not change even when they are moved around.

**Composition of a number**: Number are made of two or more other smaller numbers involving a 'part' and a 'whole'. Learning to 'see' a whole number and its parts at the same time.

**Subitise**: Look at a group of objects and realis how many there re without counting.

## - Number 5

- Counting out five Matching numerals to written and spoken numerals Pentagon (five straight sides and five corners) Using/adding different combination of coins to make 5p ordinal numbers 5<sup>th</sup> Number formation 5 'o'clock.
  Subitise numbers to 5 Number Bonds to 5, partitioning number 5 and finding the different combinations e.g. 1+4 2+3 3+2 4+1
- Children count 1-10 on a number track (Can say one more/less than a number)
- Days of the week what come before... what comes after...?

Over the next few weeks we will be consolidating all the learning for numbers 1-5. Please support your child to continue to reinforce previous learning.

## Topic

We will continue to learn about the importance of 'light' in different cultural celebrations. Next week is 1<sup>st</sup> December and we will introduce the importance of Advent in the Christian calendar. The children will also continue to share the text 'Owl Babies' and talk about how light and dark affects how we feel.

The children in Monet Class have had an exciting week inventing and making their healthy fruit smoothies. They were all delicious! We have been busy writing instructions on how to make them.



Next week in English we will be focusing on capital letters (when to use them and correct formation) by looking at the features of a letter, names and addresses and writing invitations.

In Maths we will be continuing to look at partitioning 2-digit numbers, adding and subtracting multiples of 10 and adding by counting on.

In Geography we will be thinking about the route we take to school and trying to draw (or make) a map of our route.

In Art we will be making calendars and continuing our collage theme by linking this to the seasons. We will also be compiling our 'kindness' advent calendar and linking this to feelings in PSHE. Home Learning will be on Google Classroom.

## Hockney

As promised last week please find below some images of our work from the Ashmolean workshop. The children really enjoyed making the different artefacts and predominantly focused on making Egyptian toys such as the skittles game you can see below. There was also a new game we were introduced to, a sort of Egyptian Snakes & Ladders, so the children tried to recreate this as you can see below.





In Maths next week we will be continuing our work on multiplication and division. We have been focusing on better understanding and recalling our times tables and revisiting grouping and arrays. In Year 4 we have begun to look at how numbers divide by 10 and 100 and how we manipulate numbers in order to do this.

In English next week we will start our new topic focusing on autobiographies. We will be learning what makes an autobiography different from other types of text and what key features we find in autobiographies. If you are able to, it would be really helpful to talk to your child about some important memories to help them better understand what an autobiography is.

In Geography next week we will be looking at the river Nile and debating the pros and cons of damming the Nile. We will identify the Aswan dam and the Nile Delta on a map and discuss the role they play within Egyptian society.

In PSHE we will be focusing on conflicts within friendships, trying to better understand why we might fall out with our friends and what we can do to resolve these conflicts. We will be learning to identify triggers within friendship groups so we know how best to avoid these and be given some strategies that we can put in place to try and resolve issues with our friends ourselves.

## Hepworth

The weeks are flying past this term! The children in Hepworth are working hard and should be proud of the standard of work many are striving to achieve as the term is progressing.

We are expecting year 5 to take part in forest school on Monday afternoon. Please remember to wear leggings or jogging bottoms, with your Christmas jumper on the top half of the body.

## English

Next week we will be focussing on persuasive writing. We will learn about and explore the language features specific to this form of writing. We will then use all we've learned to produce our own different types of persuasive writing linked to our learning about World War II. At the end of the week we will then link this with our computing work to create a radio advert using recording software. Our spelling rule will be the suffix 'sion' and our grammar focus is on punctuating direct speech.

## Maths

We continue to need our times tables next week as we learn about division. In years 5 and 6 the focus is on using formal methods of calculations. Both year groups will be taught short division (bus stop method) and year 6 will also progress to long division (dividing by 2-digit numbers).

## Other subjects

Year 6 will begin to make their cushions on Monday. If they have any fabric they would particularly like to use or anything they wish to attach to it, they are welcome to bring it in.

In science we will explore how the different elements of the circulatory system work together. We will be doing some cooking using a war time ration recipe for our DT topic.

Singing for our carol service in the last week of term is also beginning and next week all children will receive a script with their lines for the service.
