### Artist of the Week


This week's artist was Rachel Jones and our sketch book theme was taking a line for a walk.

## Class News

### Van Gogh

Thank you to all the parents who attended the workshops over the last few weeks. I appreciate, it might have been quite over whelming but would like to reassure you that all my notes from the workshops will be made available to you and the news letters will give you a further breakdown of subjects and topics as we go through the year. If you are not sure of anything please feel to ask. I am happy to go through things again if required.

### Phonics

Following the workshop you now have a deeper understanding of why it is important for children to be secure at Phase One Phonics in order to confidently access Phase Two. Therefore, please continue to reinforce listening to sounds in the environment, rhyme, alliteration (initial sounds), segmenting and blending and sharing books.

To date the children have learnt the following sounds **s - a - t - p - i - n - m - d**. We have been focusing on them listening to these sounds within words e.g. **r - ai - n p - a - n d - o - ll l - i - d s - a - t c - u - p p - i - g**. Please continue to do oral segmenting and blending with your child, to support their learning and applying of these sounds e.g. please pass be the b-a-g... can you put on your c-oa-t... it is time to go to b-e-d. Then ask them to tell you what sound they hear in words e.g. jam j-a-m, dog d-o-g etc.

This week we have also introduced the tricky words... **it, is, at, in**, please reinforce these at home.

### Library Books

Please note library books are changed every Tuesday, if you wish to keep the book a little bit longer you may do.

### Maths

This week we have continued to learn about number two. The children have been learning all about 'pairs' and have been matching two items that are the same and looking in the environment for things that come in pairs e.g. pair of socks, pairs of eyes etc.

Next week we will continue with number two and will be learning about:

- Ordinal numbers... 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>
- We will introduce addition, talking about one cube and another cube making two cubes.

- We will look at how to read and write a number sentence  $1+1=2$  one add one equals two.
- We will introduce doubling (Two of the same thing), double one equal two
- Our shape of the week will be a semi-circle. We will model using a stem sentence and creating the shape with your finger. 'I am a Semi-Circle, I have one curved side one straight side and two corners.'
- Finally talking about how half of a circle is a semi-circle, we will introduce halving (sharing between two groups) e.g. half of two is one.

Please continue to reinforce number recognition and ordering from 1-10/15/20.

### **Topic**

This week we will continue to talk about Harvest and prepare for the Harvest Assembly. We will also introduce autumn and changes in the environment.

### **General**

Please support your child to practice getting undressed and dressed independently, including doing up zips and buttons.

## Hepworth

This coming week is Assessment Week, so all children will be tested on their English, Reading and Maths. We don't want the children to worry about this though, as it is a tool for us teachers to explore the childrens' strengths, as well as where they need extra help. This means that pupils will have fewer English and Maths lessons than usual, but they will still be building on their knowledge and skills in these subjects.

In English children will read more Greek Myths, developing their understanding of themes and language through inference and role play, with a view to writing their own myth. Our spelling rule will be the prefixes dis and auto.

In Maths the children will start the week practising mental strategies for addition and subtraction, then continue with multiplying numbers, including decimals, by 10, 100 and 1000.

On Monday afternoon, Year 5 will add new formulae to their Spreadsheets, followed by making Spanish sentences to describe weather and seasons in connection with notable dates such as their birthday, Christmas etc. (At the same time, Year 6 will in Forest School.) In PE, children will develop their group dance relating to the planets, which feeds into our Science Space theme. And in Science itself students will build on their understanding of Earth's movement in the Solar System, to understand time zones.

Our Stargazers Topic about Ancient Greece will focus on the olympics – how they formed, how they worked and differences to today.

In RE we will look at how where Hindus might go on pilgrimage and in PSHE children will learn what consent means and how to seek and give/not give permission in different situations. Our music lessons continue with work on Livin' on a Prayer.

Finally, we are holding Parents' Evenings after school on Wednesday and Thursday, and we look forward to seeing you then. In the meantime, we hope you have an enjoyable weekend.
