Headteacher's News

This week has seen some adaptions to our provision of remote learning and I have been grateful for the constructive feedback that parents have shared to enable us to continue our provision for the children. It has been a real pleasure for me to see many of the children enjoying their google meet sessions. I have added a new document to the <u>school website</u> today, that provides further information about what you can expect from our remote learning provision.

Our live teaching sessions on google meet have been going very well but teaching staff have raised a few issues with me and we would be grateful if you could ensure you reinforce the following messages with your children at home:

- Children must be appropriately dressed in daytime clothes at all times, as should any other household members who may appear in the background.
- Children should not be eating during the lesson
- Live video calls should be in a quiet room in the house and without the presence of siblings, preferably with the children sitting at a table ready to learn.
- Backgrounds should be neutral and not changed during the sessions. (Teachers are finding it difficult to see work children are showing them when children use the virtual backgrounds)
- Children should be muted to reduce background noise (Please remember however that your child may have needed to unmute to participate and family members and comments can be heard in the background!)
- At least three children must be present for live lessons to take place.

Children and Parent's Wellbeing

There is an expectation from the government for us to be setting a minimum of 4 hours of remote learning a day for children in KS2. We are fulfilling this requirement but I am aware that some children are finding it difficult to complete all of the work set each day and have displayed some anxiety about it. It is important that children do their best to complete the work set but not at the expense of either their or your well-being. If your child has spent a reasonable amount of time and tried their best it is perfectly acceptable to submit a partially completed piece of work. Your children do need to have time away from computer screens and it is important to ensure they have regular opportunities to relax. If they were in school they would be having regular breaks (playtimes, assemblies, daily mile, story times) from completing work during the school day. The fact that the children are learning at home does not lessen the need for short regular breaks from their learning tasks. If you have any concerns at all about how your child is managing the set work please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher via the school office. They will be only too happy to support you.

New Interactive Whiteboards

I am pleased to say that this week we have had new interactive whiteboards installed in Monet, Hockney and Hepworth classrooms. They are a significant improvement on the ones that they replaced and I am really grateful to the PTA who have contributed half of the cost to enable us to proceed with the work.
