Class News

Van Gogh

The children are getting tired, it is a really big change for them from previous settings. Over the next few weeks you may find they don't want to come to school or they are talking about their nursery settings. This is quite normal as they transition into a new environment and way of learning. I think we're all counting down to half term!

Phonics

This week we introduce the $\mathbf{s} - \mathbf{a} - \mathbf{t} - \mathbf{p}$, we will continue to revisit these and think about how to form them correctly. I will talk more about this in the Phonics workshop.

Next week we will continue to revise Phase One, which covers segmenting and blending, rhyme, listening to instrumental sounds and initial sounds in words. We will also be starting Phase 2 and introducing sounds $\mathbf{i} - \mathbf{n} - \mathbf{m} - \mathbf{d}$

We will also continue to work on rhyming words, two words that sound the same and listening out for initial sounds in a word. The children have found these areas tricky, we would appreciate if you could reinforce this at home as well. Some ideas... Rhyming Bingo (Matching words that rhyme) – Share story books with rhyme e.g. Oi Frog! – Make up silly rhymes with names e.g. Dean – Bean OR objects in the environment e.g. Cars – Mars. For initial sounds... Show them a couple of objects or pictures, e.g. a sock and an apple which one begins with the 's' sound. Play I Spy... something beginning with the sound 'a'.

Maths

Over the next few weeks we will continue to chant numbers to 10/20 and count back from 10. We will continue to reinforce Number One and Number Two and continue learning about things that come in pairs. The children will also start to pay for their Snack Shop where they will use their knowledge of ONE (1p) to buy their snack. Please continue to reinforce number recognition and ordering from 1-10/15/20.

Topic

Next week we will introduce Harvest and start preparing for the Harvest Assembly. We will be talking about the importance of Harvest and start to think about where food comes from. We will also continue to work painting our portraits.

General

Please support your child to practice getting undressed and dressed independently, including doing up zips and buttons.

Monet

We've had a busy week this week completing our Monet information leaflets and designing and creating our edible gardens. Next week, when the clay is dry, we will paint our Monet bridges for our gardens and watch our cress and mustard seeds grow.

Next week we will be thinking about the steps needed to write instructions and write a set of instructions on how to create a miniature garden.

In maths Years 1 and 2 we will be continuing with number bonds to 10 and 20 and using these to write addition and subtraction sentences, solve and create our own word problems. We will be focusing on the relationship of addition and subtraction so children not only know that 14 + 6 = 20 but also 20 - 6 = 14 and use this for real life problems and missing number problems.

In science we will be thinking about the basic needs of humans and animals.

Recent reading assessments have shown that there are some children in Year 1 and 2 who are still not familiar with all of the phase 3 and 4 'tricky words'. These are the common words that they have to learn by sight as they are tricky to read phonetically. I have put a copy of these on Google classroom and will be handing them out at parents evening in a few weeks. Please look at these with your child and practise any that are not known. Phases 3 and 4 should be known confidently by the beginning of Year 1. Lots of regular shared reading at home will ensure that children come across these words frequently.

We are very excited about our Athletics event at Dr Challoner's High School on Tuesday morning. Please see the letter sent out previously for details. We will be meeting at Little Chalfont Library between 9am and 9.15am.

Hockney

This week the children have been extremely excited about planning their own mystery story. We have been looking at different mystery story tasters and talking about their features. Next week the children will be writing their own mystery story as part of our autumn writing assessment. The children will be using the knowledge they have acquired over this half term to write an engaging story, carefully describing setting, problem, resolution and ending. You can help your child at home by encouraging them to talk about what they would like to write about, who the main characters would be, who would be the villain in the story etc. They could draw their characters, make them out of play dough and act out their story. All this will help them with their writing next week.

In maths the children will start to add and subtract ones, tens and hundreds. Year 4 children will be adding four digit numbers with no exchange, one exchange and more than one exchange using the vertical method. Year 3 children will be using number lines and place value charts to help them with their addition and subtraction. We will also be focusing on problem solving such as:

a)
$$34 + 7 = 352$$

In our topic lesson, we will be learning about early humans and the Palaeolithic period. Thank you for supporting your children at home and allowing them to share their artefacts with their classmates. The children are very eager to learn about the Prehistory and love sharing their knowledge with the rest of the class, which is great to see.

Please continue supporting your child with their Doodle learning we would love to win the competition and get £50 to spend on the games for our class.

Hepworth

Hepworth have had another good week all round and are proving themselves to be very good school role models. They have worked hard in their lessons, but also taken time to be responsible and kind towards others around the whole school. Well done!

Next week in English the SPAG focus will be learning about synonyms and antonyms. Our spelling pattern is words beginning 'trans' and 'tele'. We will start a new stimulus book, 'Greek Myths', which feeds into this term's Topic, Ancient Greece. The children have shown great enthusiasm for this subject so far, so we're sure they'll enjoy it. Ironically, in Maths pupils will focus on another classic civilisation learning about Roman numerals and how their mathematical system relates to ours today. We will also look at multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000 including decimals.

Whilst Year 6 have Forest School on Monday afternoon, Year 5 will carry on looking at Spreadsheets in Computing. They will then focus on dates, weather and seasons in Spanish. In our Science Topic, 'Earth and Space', children will learn about the scientific reasons for night and day and how they can be proved. This theme then continues into PE with children creating planetary dance movement to Holst's The Planets.

In RE we will consider what we might learn from the Buddha's life story and where Buddhists go on pilgrimage. Our music lesson was very enjoyable this week, and next week we continue by listening and appraising 'We Will Rock You' by Queen and comparing it with 'Livin' on a Prayer' by Bon Jovi. In Topic, we will be learning more about Alexander the Great.

We would like to emphasise the real need to practice times tables. So much of what we cover in maths lessons in years 5 and 6 relies on the ability to quickly recall the times tables up to 12x12. It is significantly hindering some of the children in their lessons when they don't know these. We will share some useful websites on Google Classroom for the children to use to practice these. There are also lots of times tables songs on music streaming sites such as Spotify - perhaps having these on in the car in the morning could help! Please ensure you are doing all you can to help your child with these.
